LONDON, July 15.-Scotland Yard is engaged with the murder of an American woman and has called the Police of the United States requesting the arrest of the woman's husband, Dr. Hawley Crippen, who sailed for New York on Saturday last. The case is strikingly similar to that of the Charlton murder at Lake Como, Italy. Both women are Americans and actresses, who left their homes to meet death by violence in a foreign land, and in each instance the police pursued the husband to the shores of their native land.

Wm Fraser of East Point rode on his wheel to Montague on Wednesday last, a distance of 45 miles, in slightly over four hours.

Montague dealers are paying from thirty-eight to forty cents a bushel for oats, twenty-two to twenty-five cents a bushel for potatoes, fifteen cents a dozen for eggs, four to five dollars a ton for hay, and six and a half cents a pound for beef.

Dealers in Souris are paying forty-two cents a bushel for oats, twenty-two cents a bushel for potatoes, fifteen cents a dozen for eggs, four to five dollars a ton for hay, and six and a half cents a pound for beef.

SMALLPOX IN CAMPBELLTON.

CAMPBELLTON, July 15.-Pestilence has added its horrors to the plight of the hopeless people of Campbellton. Smallpox broke out among the refugees in the tents, and was promptly reported. Isolation was at once established, and vigorous action was taken to prevent the spread of the dread disease.

The people are cheerful, but seemed stunned by the awfulness of the catastrophe, and are just beginning to realize that the worst is before them. Everyone who can is leaving the town, and those who remain are huddled together in tents or shelters made of blankets and boards thrown hastily together. Many are in the open fields or woods back of the town without any shelter whatever and very little clothing. Food is plentiful and is being issued in regular way, so no one need suffer with hunger. Order is again established in the fire district. Brave spirits have set themselves to the task of building a new town and home. The situation is unique, and in a few years the same energy that made Campbellton a busy centre in so short a time, will build a better and more beautiful town.
