### ROYAL WELCOME EXTENDED

#### To Corp'l. Brown Upon His Return to His Home In Little York.

The reception in honor of Corp'l. H. H. Browne, late of the R. C. R., of South Africa, was held Tuesday night in York Hall. The weather and roads being favorable the room was more than comfortably filled. The hall was beautifully decorated with flags and evergreens. On the wall were the words "Welcome Home" artistically designed. Conspicuous among the guests assembled were Rev. Mr. Hicks and Mrs. Hicks and the relatives and friends of Mr. Brown who occupied seats on the platform. The dainties prepared by the ladies and the entertainment furnished by talent of York and Union was equal to, if not superior in quality to that of previous occasions. Major Crockett in opening extended to Corp'l. Brown a very hearty and sincere welcome. He referred to the circumstances under which Mr. Browne left us; the good account which he together with the other members of the R. C. R. gave of themselves while in South Africa and of the high position he has held and will continue to hold in the estimation of all who know him. He was a general favorite. No settlement or locality in Canada had a better representative on the velts of South Africa than Little York. Mr. Browne on rising to speak was cheered to the echo. Words failed to impress his appreciation of the kindness shown him since coming home. After some preliminary remarks of a highly complimentary character he proceeded to give a brief but very interesting sketch of his experiences. His references to the grim realities of war were very touching. There is nothing worse than victory but defeat. The saddest and most impressive part of a soldier's duty is the burial of the dead. He sacrificed home and loved ones at duties call and should he ever be called upon again he was ready to go. Mr. Brown was listened to with breathless

attention for upwards of half an hour.

Rev. Mr. Hicks being called upon responded in his usual heartwarming manner. He reviewed the triumphs of British arms from the Battle of Inkermann, 1855 to the Battle of Paardeberg 1900. We are justly proud of our record. Our loyalty and patriotism is greater today than ever before. From all parts of the world patriots flocked to maintain the integrity of the British Empire. General Lord Roberts considered that the Canadians were equal to the flower of the British Army. Canada is to be congratulated on the personnel of her Contingent.

They were men of wealth and influence, there were farmers, mechanics, and lawyers, there were doctors, teachers and professors, all standing shoulder to shoulder in one common cause: to teach the Boer what true liberty implies.

In tendering his thanks to the committee for the invitation to attend the reception Mr. Hicks generously offered his services in putting any young couple out of misery who should so desire. After attending to the wants of the inner man the following program was rendered:
