June Rainfall Heaviest For 33 Years

June rainfall recorded at the Charlottetown Experimental Station this year was the heaviest since June, 1914. It was learned from figures supplied over the week-end by Mr. Warren Burns, weather observer at the Station. He measured the precipitation at 5.16 inches in June, 1944, 5.14 inches were measured, while in June, 1914 it was 5.32 and in 1906, 5.37. The 46-year average rainfall for June is 2.81 inches. Last year it was 1.53.

Anglican Bishop Visits Churches

His Lordship, Bishop G. F. Kingston, Bishop of Nova Scotia, administered confirmation yesterday evening to 24 candidates at St. Paul's Church who were presented to his Lordship by the rector, the Rev. J. T. Ibbott. The Bishop's first service yesterday was held in the morning at St. Peter's Cathedral, where he administered confirmation to several candidates presented to him by the rector, the Rev. Canon E. M. Malone. His Lordship also received several others who had already received their confirmation in the Eastern Orthodox Church. Before the conclusion of the service, His Lordship commended the rector, wardens, and congregation of St. Peter's for the advances made since his last visit.

The Bishop held his second confirmation service yesterday at St. John's Church, Milton, where the candidates were presented to His Lordship by the rector, the Rev. S. J. Davies. This week he will visit the Anglican churches at Georgetown, Cherry Valley, Rustice, Kensington, and Port Hill, and on Sunday His Lordship will be at Summerside and St. Eleanor's.

'Larry Darrell was very real to me,' says Power. 'I felt I knew him. I'd known a few fellows like him, and had talked to men in the Marines about the things that had troubled Larry. It was an exciting, challenging kind of role.'

Pleased With Appearance Of Crops Here

The growth of all farm crops in the rural districts around Charlottetown is as far ahead as it is in any farming district east of Alberta, Mr. R. C. Parent, superintendent of the Charlottetown Dominion Experimental Station, informed the Guardian last night. Mr. Parent's statement was made from first-hand knowledge of crop-growing conditions since he has recently returned by plane from attending the 27th annual convention of the Agricultural Institute of Canada at Lethbridge, Alta. Sowing and planting was late this season in every Province from Alberta east, Mr. Parent said, and particularly so in New Brunswick and Quebec. Ontario and western farmers have also experienced serious set-backs due in many instances to flooded areas. Only in the irrigated sections of the West, Alberta, Mr. Parent said, did he witness any crop developments which could approximate that in Prince Edward Island.

Mr. Parent said the theme upon which most discussion centred at the Lethbridge convention was soil conservation because that is the most serious problem confronting western farmers. No such problem has been greatly concerned about soil fertility. About 400 members of the Institute were present at the Lethbridge convention. Mr. Parent said, with many prominent farmers attending from the United States.

Scout News and Notices Successful Leadership Camp The leadership training course conducted at the Y.M.C.A. Holland Camp, was a decided success. Over fifty young people from various parts of Prince Edward Island representing the Boy Scouts, Girl Guides, Red Cross, Y.M.C.A., Knights of Columbus and the A.Y.P.A. attended the course. The course was operated as a co-operative venture under the direction of the P. E. I. Branch of the Canadian Camping Association. Instructions were given in Camp Management, First-Aid, Water Safety, Life Saving, Handicrafts, Nature Study, and Juvenile Behaviour Problems. Staff members included Ralph MacLean, Mrs. Harry Cadmore, Mrs. J. A. McConnell, Estelle-Haines, Felice Arsenault, and J. A. McConnell. The Camp Council elected by the campers attending the course consisted of Ivan Robinson, Chairman; Betty King, Florine Evans, Lois Arsenault, Ed Mullins, and James Blair. The Camp Council organized a number of recreational activities as a laboratory experience in camp leadership. Participants in the course will serve as Camp Councilors in most of the P. E. I. youth camps this summer. A large number attending the course will serve as Red Cross swimming instructors, at a number of points on the Island during the summer. The project while in the experimental stage this year will be continued next season with considerable expansion in program and increase in time. This is the first attempt at the kind of co-operative leadership training scheme that has been made in Canada on a Provincial basis.
