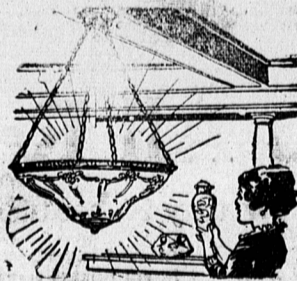

POLICE COURT.—At the police court yesterday morning one man for breach of the Prohibition Act was fined \$300—an unusually heavy fine as his offence was aggravated by the fact of his having been a bailiff at Supreme Court. Two drunks were fined \$20 or thirty days, one drunk \$30 or ninety days and one drunk dismissed. One man charged with assault and battery was fined \$1. or ten days. Three men appeared for infringement of the city by laws, two being fined \$5 or twenty days and the third dismissed. One man for breach of the motor vehicle act was fined \$5.

SHIP HAD ROUGH WEATHER.—The tern schooner Victory Chimes, whose arrival in Cardigan was reported in the Guardian last week, had a memorable voyage from Mobile to Martineque, W. I. I. where she arrived on March 4th. Captain Buchanan, who was in charge, was forced to jettison half the cargo to save the ship in the heavy weather through which she passed. Arriving at Martineque he had no bucket of water left, and no provisions. The return of the ship from Martineque to Georgetown was made in twenty days. The mainspring of the ship's chronometer having been carried away in her former passage the return trip home had to be made on dead reckoning. The recent electrical storm delayed the schooner four days. Captain Buchanan was in the city yesterday and was registered at the Revere.

INTERESTING DEMONSTRATION OF BARNET REFRIGERATOR AT BEER & WEEKS STORE.

It is guaranteed that the new Barnett system of refrigerator will preserve these articles perfectly and that no taint nor odor will be apparent. The matches will be struck on the inside walls of the ice chamber to show that there is perfect air circulation and dryness.

The public is invited to be present this afternoon when the refrigerator is unlocked and to test the truth of the claims regarding the "Barnet".

Mr. Adams, in charge of the demonstration will be glad to answer any questions.

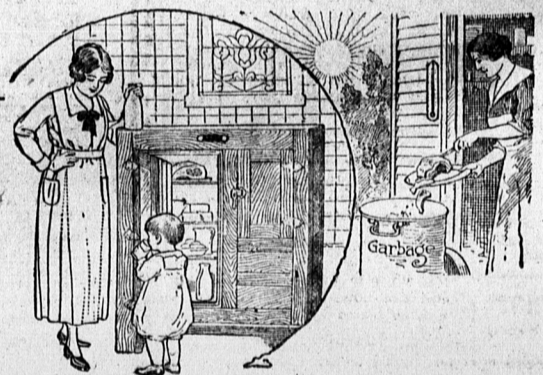
