### ROBBED CUSTOMS

#### FOR MANY YEARS.

NEW YORK, Oct. 20—Eight years of systematic and exceedingly profitable cheating of the United States government was described today by George E. Birge, a customs weigher, who was called as a witness in the trial of Antonio and Philip Musica, cheese importers.

After describing how he underweighed a large importation of cheese for the Musica and received one hundred and ninety-four dollars as his share of the profits, he said that he had similar dealings with hundreds of other firms of importers. Not all, he said, were such big cases as the transaction with the Musica, but there was a regular system of cheating in which a number of customs employees were involved. Birge is one of three weighers who has confessed and is testifying for the government.

The frauds in the importation of sugar, which were aired some time ago in the government's suits against the American Sugar Refining Company, were again brought up in Birge's testimony. He said that prior to his operations for the Musica and others, he was almost exclusively employed in underweighing and cheating on behalf of "The Sugar People."

### NOTES AND NEWS OF NORTH SYDNEY.

NORTH SYDNEY, Oct. 20—About 9 o'clock Saturday morning, Joseph Howarth a miner in No. 5 colliery, Sydney Mines, was instantly killed by a fall of stone. The victim's back was broken and he lived but two or three minutes after the accident. Howarth came here from the old country about a year ago. He was thirty-three years of age and is survived by a wife and four children who reside in Florence.

### MANY STRIKERS RETURN TO WORK.

GLACE BAY, Oct. 20—There is rarely a week during the past few months that some of the men, tiring of lying around in idleness, and unable to support his family upon the allowance made by the Union, have applied at the collieries and obtained work at one of the mines. Yesterday Malcolm Boyd, a prominent member of the U.M.W., Local at Dominion No. 6, removed to Dominion No. 2 where he has taken a house and returned to work for the company at that colliery today. Mr Boyd hauled his furniture to New Aberdeen yesterday and will reside there in future. It is a well known fact that Mr Boyd was the mover of the motion calling a strike at No 6 colliery before the sixth of July, and was until recently one of the most prominent strikers in the collieries. It is also stated that the Secretary of the U.M.W. Local at Dominion No 12 has also returned to work for the company. Two other prominent local men in the early counsels of the U.M.W. returned to work yesterday morning.

Among the old miners who have been attending their farm work in the country during the past few months, twenty arrived in town on Monday and have returned to their old places in the collieries.

### SCOTCH BANK CLERKS FOR CANADA.

MONTREAL, Oct 20—The announcement that the Union Bank had brought over some thirty young Scotch bank clerks, and that the Royal Bank of Canada twenty more, has provoked the query as to whether these new comers were in competition with the home supply. It was ascertained, however, that the Canadian Banking business is developing so rapidly that the banks cannot keep up the supply, hence the absolute necessity of getting men from abroad, and generally speaking the Scotch bank clerks are well trained, and as the chances for promotion are better on this side, the venture is satisfactory all round.

### RUSSIANS TO OCCUPY FINLAND.

ST PETERSBURG, Oct 20—A report has current yesterday that orders have been issued for the mobilization of the first corps of the Russian Guard, preliminary to the occupation of Finland. While an investigation proved the report to be premature, it also established that such military occupation of the Grand Duchy may take place if it is found necessary thus to enforce the wishes of the Russian Government. Before active steps are taken the authorities will await further information regarding the feeling in Finland, and the attitude of the Senate towards the Russian demand upon the Finnish treasury for the national defence.

Grand Duke Nicholas Nicolaievitch, commander of the Russian Imperial Guard, has returned to the capital to take personal charge of the despatch of the troops in the

### CENTENNIAL CONVENTION OF THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH.

PITTSBURG, October 00—The ninth and concluding day's session of the International Centennial and convention of the Disciples of Christ (Christian Church) was held yesterday. Among the \$40,000 delegates it is the belief that great good in Christian churches all over the country will follow.

The proceedings developed a number of noteworthy achievements. Forty times more delegates attended this convention than the one held in this city eighteen years ago. In a century the Christian Church has secured 1,300,000 communicants, 11,714 churches, 8-752 Bible schools, and 6,461 ministers. Nearly a million students are enrolled in the Bible schools and the total Church valuation is \$29,742,244.

The steamer "Oregon," built by the Church in the local shipyards, was dedicated and then dismantled for shipment to the Congo river, where it enters the missionary field.

Over \$100,000 was contributed in open meetings for carrying on work at home and abroad. Scores of addresses and prominent business dresses were delivered by Senators, men, while the crowning climax was reached last Sunday, when over 25,000 persons gathered at the baseball

park here and partook of the Lord's Supper, which, it is said, were the most marvellous Communion service ever attempted in this country.

### LEADER OF BRITAIN'S POLICY WRITES PLAY.

NEW YORK, Oct 20—Vance Thompson cables The American from Paris. "I have had to break through the reserve of an old English family of title and satisfy to pride of a national political reputation to induce a genius to allow me to show America his work," said Amelia Bingham yesterday.

Miss Bingham is making a short visit to Paris to order costumes and scenery for this new play, "The Violet Window," which seems to have provoked the enthusiasm of the actress-manager.

"My new play" continued Miss Bingham, "is by an Englishman of national importance, who refuses to allow his identity to be hidden in the name of 'George David.' It was with difficulty that I persuaded him to permit me to produce this, his latest work, Playwriting has been his fad, but only for selfish pleasure, and got many friends of this well known leader have the least idea that the statesman who controls the policy of great government has a lighter side to his character. One peculiar point in the play is that it has a love story showing the greatest depths of sentiment and feeling and all this has been written by a man who has been looked upon as loveless.

### INVENTS A NEW EXPLOSIVE.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct 20—A new explosive, of British invention, which possesses the possibilities it is said, of revolutionizing the blasting work in connection with the construction of the Panama canal, has been tested on the Isthmus of Panama and as a result the Panama canal commission ordered twenty tons of it for trial.

The inventor's exhaustive tests before the members of the Isthmian canal commission showed that it is absolutely impossible to explode by ordinary means.

It can only be set off by heating a small platinum wire just inside the open end by an electric spark or

It is claimed that the new explosive is 50 per cent stronger than the 66 per cent grade of dynamite and that the cost of manufacturing will be more than 20 per cent cheaper. So confident is the British inventor that he will secure the contract to furnish all the explosives to be used on the canal this year. It is stated that he has organized a company which will at once erect a factory on the Isthmus with the capital of between \$6,000 and 7,000 per annum.

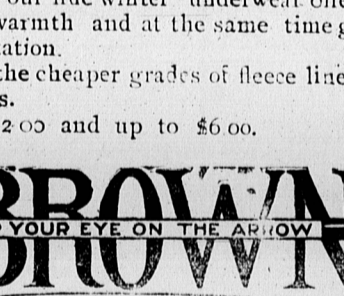
