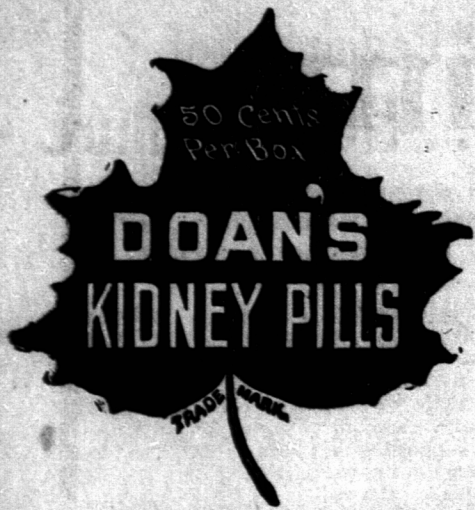

## THE INDIAN FAMINE.

A citizen has handed to THE GUARDIAN a handsome donation of \$20 for the Indian Famine Fund, coupled with the request that we shall receive and acknowledge other donations for the same worthy object. We have decided to do so, and will be glad to receive and forward any sums that may be sent in for that purpose. In the case of sums of one dollar and upwards each the names of the donors will be published and in cases where the individual amounts are less than one dollar, the total amount will be collectively acknowledged, with due credit to the person collecting the same.

The urgency of the need is very clearly shown by the following extract from the official report of United States Council William T. Fee at Bombay. He says:

"The people of India are now faced with a famine of water, food and cattle, which in the particular areas affected is unprecedented in character and intensity."

"At this period of the famine of 1896-7, only 1,000,000 persons were receiving Government relief in all India; today the official estimate places the number at 3,500,000 and the daily expenditure at about \$84,000.

"The true famine area in British India and the native States is about 300,000 square miles, with a population of 40,000,000. There is a further area of about 145,000 square miles with a population of 210,000,000, in which more or less scarcity and distress prevail, where relief is already being given in a tentative form, or will probably have to be given before the advent of the next monsoon.

"The most trying period of the famine is still two months ahead, and even now it is questionable whether the financial resources of the government and the power to provide useful employment for such vast numbers will be equal to the strain, if present standards are to be maintained."

It has been decided to observe Friday 11th May as Arbor Day in our city schools.

Premier Joe Martin is said to have decided to seek re-election in Victoria, which is one of the constituencies believed to be most strongly opposed to him and his policy. Mr. Martin has lots of pluck, and will not concede that he is beaten till the votes are all in.

The sounding of the steam whistle on board departing steamers just before leaving the wharf is a frequent cause of frightening teams which are near by. As the time fixed for the departure of passenger steamers is generally well known the utility of the whistle at such periods is not quite apparent. Many would be pleased to have the noise omitted.

Dr. Inch, Chief Superintendent of Education for New Brunswick has issued a circular to inspectors, trustees and teachers calling their attention to the order of the Board of Education that the teaching day immediately preceding the Queen's Birthday shall be observed as Empire Day. He also suggests an outline of proceedings suitable to the day. He asks that during the entire day the British flag shall float above the school houses. What about Empire Day in Prince Edward Island?

We confess to some surprise in finding Mr. John Anderson, after the Alliance meeting at which he was present, had unanimously pronounced in favor of Provincial Prohibition, now advocating a different plan. In his latest letter to the Patriot of yesterday Mr. Anderson suggests that another effort be made to carry the Scott Act in Charlottetown and have the vote taken on the property qualification. Mr. Anderson ought to know that in voting on the Scott Act the vote will necessarily be taken on the same lists as are used in electing members of the Federal Parliament. No provincial authority or legislation could possibly effect the manner of voting on the Scott Act, which is a Dominion law.

They have a system of "regulating" the liquor traffic in Christiana, Norway, known as the "samlag" or company system. Each of 29 companies pays \$2,500 for the privilege of selling, and the money is appropriated for charity. This plan was adopted to bring the traffic into more respectable hands. The result has been that the convictions for drink and offences connected therewith have risen from 5,941 in 1885, the year before the "samlag" system was adopted, to 15,504 in 1898. The companies are required to report the number of cases in which they refuse drinks during the year and the reasons for refusals. It appears that 1898 there were 62,289 refusals reported, for which the assigned reasons were in 40,351 cases "because already drunk," and in 20,223 other cases "because so nearly drunk that another drink would complete the operation." From this it will be seen that the convictions for drunkenness were but a small proportion of the actual drunks. On an average there were 171 tipsy citizens, too drunk to be allowed any more drink in Christiana under "respectable" high-license liquor selling.
