## POLITICAL MEETING AT UIGG.

Speeches By the Attorney General and Sir Louis H. Davies.

Nov. 15.—A large and representative audience was gathered in the Uigg Hall on Tuesday night to hear Sir Louis Davies discuss some of the political questions of the day. Hon. D. A. McKinnon, a native of Uigg, was the first speaker. He made a practical and sound common-sense speech, dealing with provincial affairs in a masterly manner. He was very well received, and was followed throughout with the closest attention.

Sir Louis Davies, on coming forward was greeted with a very complimentary address referring to the many high and honored positions in which he served his country with distinguished ability. In reply he thanked the people for their appreciation of his work and thought Belfast was signally honored in having two of her brightest sons—Hon. D. A. McKinnon and Judge McDonald—promoted to high and responsible positions.

Sir Louis held the closest attention of his hearers while he compared the record of the Laurier Government with that of their predecessors in office. The comparison, which was a fair and reasonable one, showed that the Liberals had nothing to be ashamed of. They had, he claimed, redeemed their ante-election pledges. They pledged themselves that, if given an opportunity, they would amicably and satisfactorily settle the Manitoba School Question—a question which had caused the greatest strife and bitterness. That question has been settled so that not a word of dissent is heard. That of itself, he said, is enough to entitle the Laurier Cabinet to the lasting gratitude of the people. But more can be placed to their credit. Much has been done towards removing the barriers that were a menace to the peace of ourselves and our Southern neighbors. The tariff has been reformed, and while the Opposition had claimed that the inevitable outcome of such a proceeding would be blue ruin, yet there are more factories going now, more hands employed, and more prosperity abounding in the country at the present time than at any other time in history. The Liberal Government did not claim all credit for the good times; but, as business-like men, they took advantage of the favorable natural conditions to better develop resources, etc. The granting of Preferential Trade to the Mother Country, while more closely cementing the ties that bind us to that Great Empire, makes it possible for the consumer to buy his goods cheaper. Other good measures of the Government were touched on; but in this brief report it is impossible to give a complete summary of a speech which covered so much ground. In concluding he assured his hearers that the railway and bridge are no delusion and appealed to the electors to support the candidates of the party which, on the first opportunity presented to them, are giving Belfast and Murray Harbor their dues. The Conservatives had eighteen long years in which to do something for these districts in the matter of railway communication. It is not talk but acts that should command the respect and approval of the people. The Conservatives he said, talked a great deal, but did not act; whereas the Liberals not only talked but showed that they act speak louder than their words. The Government believe that the people want the railway and bridge. He called upon the electors to now show whether or not they approve of the Government's course in granting what will undoubtedly prove a great boon to these districts.

Sir Louis was frequently and loudly cheered while delivering his address, and, being in good form, he well upheld the reputation gained by him in the days of "Auld Lang Syne"
