Speculate More Changes Imminent In The Kremlin

LONDON (AP)—The air of mystery about the future of Premier Nikita Khrushchev in Moscow still suggests more changes in the Kremlin are imminent.

Western diplomats with pipelines to Moscow said Khrushchev appears to be taking a bold gamble to tighten his grip as Soviet strongman by shoving aside his toughest remaining political rival.

The Austrian Communist party newspaper Volkstimme said in a Moscow - dated dispatch that Khrushchev "will take over an important new role" in the next few days.

The Communist news paper 'Humanite in Paris took a similar line, saying in a Moscow dispatch that Khrushchev would be assigned to important new tasks in the next few days.

Western Diplomats Believe Russian Hero Is Demoted

LONDON (CP)—Marshall Georgi K. Zhukov was relieved of his job as minister of defence without explanation Saturday night, Marshall Rodion Y. Malinovsky said in a Moscow dispatch, which was named in his place.

The bare announcement issued by the government gave no hint of the future status of Zhukov, Russia's greatest living military hero.

The announcement was issued as Zhukov, 81, returned home from a goodwill tour of Yugoslavia and Albania. This indicates the decision to oust him was made during his absence.

Malinovsky, 59, moves up from deputy minister of defence. He is a war hero of some standing, but does not enjoy as much public or military esteem as Zhukov.

He served in the Far East after the war and, prior to his new appointment, he also held the post of commander of Soviet ground forces.

MOSCOW (AP) The stark announcement of the removal of Marshal Georgi K. Zhukov as Soviet defence minister appears to have shocked many Russians.

More than anything else the supreme confidence of Nikita Khrushchev in Zhukov was the reason for his appointment to a "hot" post and that any announcement of his removal would be made with great ceremony.

Diplomats, sources used here, said that Zhukov was a bold and to describe the unexpected change was more to be expected of Zhukov's removal.

Service newspapers reported briefly that Zhukov had returned from a goodwill tour of Albania, but omitted publication of the Tass Moscow dispatch which reported he had been demoted.

High officials, including a representative of the Ministry of Defence, said that Zhukov was a hero of the war and a great military leader.

Most Western diplomats, after the Soviet announcement of Zhukov's removal, were leaving the city for the weekend.
