## Retired Freetown Man Is Found Dead In Home

**SUMMERSIDE**—A retired, export merchant, Elmer E. Sharbell, 63, was found dead on an upstairs bedroom floor of his Portage home Saturday afternoon.

A coroner's jury was convened by Dr. Charles Dewar, of O'Leary, who ordered an autopsy to establish the cause of death, as RCMP began an investigation to ascertain the recent activities of the deceased, who had not been seen for a few days.

The body was found by Lloyd Reeves of Freetown and Cecil Bolger of St. Eleonors who had motored to Portage to see the deceased accompanied by Mr. Sharbell's daughter, Mrs. Stanley Dalton of Summerside and one of her children. Mrs. Dalton had planned to pick blueberries in the area after visiting her father.

On their arrival at the home where Mr. Sharbell has resided alone, since the death of his wife about two years ago, no one appeared to be at the house. After checking with neighbors where he frequently stayed and
