**DIES LIKE HIS VICTIM**  
ABERSYCHAN, Wales (Reuters)—A man who gassed his 12-year-old son, an incurable cancer victim, has been found dead in the bedroom where the boy died seven months ago. Police said Arthur Gray, 45, found guilty of the mercy-killing of his son Richard, died during the weekend, apparently of gas poisoning. At the trial, the judge placed Gray on probation for two years.
