

Election Not Expected To Hold Up Causeway

The inconclusive result of Monday's federal election should make no difference to the P.E.I. N.B. causeway project, Fisheries Minister Angus MacLean said yesterday before leaving for Ottawa with Mrs. MacLean.

Although he could not speak officially, Mr. MacLean explained that the decision to build it had been taken by the government, and three engineering firms had been engaged to help plan and construct the proposed structure across the Northumberland Strait. This decision, on June 8, was announced to the country in a Canadian Press report from Ottawa the following day.

THREE FIRMS NAMED
The three firms, all of which have offices in the Maritime Provinces, are H.G. Acres & Co., Niagara Falls, Ont.; Estabrook and Mont, Quebec; and Shippan N.B.; and Canadian-British Engineering, Toronto, and Halifax, N.S.

The announcement by an unnamed source, a public works spokesman said the planning stage would occupy two years, and building would take a further six or seven years, something that had been stated in a previous department report.

Mr. MacLean suggested that the possible development of a coalition government, featuring the PCs and some other group, should make no difference to the project, as the decision had already been taken and the actual planning set in motion prior to the election. Mr. MacLean added, "Of course, I'm not saying there will be a minority government," but he agreed that such a development does seem possible in view of what happened across the nation Monday, with no party having anything close to a majority.

SOME SPECULATION
There was considerable speculation here yesterday as to what effect the Diefenbaker "Well build the Causeway" announcement had on the vote in the province. "I don't know," a number of veteran political observers suggested yesterday that the definite undertaking had a major effect on the "solid-four" sweep of P.E.I. seats. Many felt the third stage PC enthusiasts suggested it was a renunciation of a government that had been in power since 1957, as they had stressed throughout the entire campaign.

Douglas Starts Charting Future Course For NDP

After his first personal defeat in the 1958 federal election, Douglas returned to his office Tuesday to chart the future course for himself and the New Democratic Party.

There was a possibility the ST - year - old former Saskatchewan CCF premier would meet the party's national executive in the latter this week, but party officials suggested such a meeting would more likely be deferred until he has had a holiday.

Mr. Douglas and his wife Irma, made plans to leave Regina Friday for a week's vacation at their cottage at Carlyle Lake, 100 miles southeast of the provincial capital.

In Monday's voting Mr. Douglas was defeated in Regina City by incumbent Progressive Conservative Ken More in a four-way contest. Mr. More polled 21,986 and the NDP leader 12,479 votes.

While Mr. Douglas was losing his own electoral battle, his party swelled its representation in the Commons to 19 from eight seats.

His only comment Tuesday was that "the election left nobody particularly happy, except possibly the Social Credit group from Quebec, which surprised everybody."

Shaw Sees Vindication Of PC Policies In P.E.I.

A complete vindication of Progressive Conservative policies, in relation to this province, is seen by Premier Walter R. Shaw, as a result of the voting here in Monday's federal election.

FACED DIFFICULTIES

However, "Prime Edward Ives had done a tremendous task and is an example of appreciation shown by the people for what is generally recognized as a tremendous and progressive development, by both the federal and provincial governments."

"The plan will go through, because it keeps its promise. But in view of Liberal opposition to it, and statements made in Ontario, I would be doubtful of its future under a changed government."

"We saw no need of a provincial election under the immediate future. We have a constructive program underway at the present time and intend to proceed to it in an orderly and progressive manner. There is no need of a provincial election at all for some time yet."
