

Tenders Close Today For EFC TV Rights

OTTAWA (CP)—Tenders for television rights to Eastern Football Conference games next season will close at 2 p.m. on Nov. 27, the EFC television committee announced Monday.

After a six-hour session here which also dealt with a report that Ottawa Rough Riders were breaking conference regulations by offering bonuses to their players, the committee said the tenders are being called on a one-year or more basis.

This means that a network could make an offer for as many years as it would like to have TV rights to the games. The successful bidder would also have an option on the TV rights to the Grey Cup game to the East.

The private CTV network has held the rights in the East for the last two seasons. It is reported to have paid \$75,000 for them in 1962.

Teo Workman, president of Montreal Alouettes and spokesman for the committee, said the highest bid would not necessarily be accepted.

NOT JUST MONEY

"I would like to emphasize that CTV didn't get the rights only because of the money involved," he said. "There were other considerations which we considered very important."

He did not say what these considerations were.

The meeting was called primarily to file a report that the Ottawa club offered a bonus to its players if they win Saturday's EFC semi-final game here against Montreal.

Such bonuses are not allowed by the conference and Workman said reports of them have caused some unrest among Montreal players.

Workman said that Ottawa officials had admitted offering "travel allowances" to its players provided Riders "do well on the field Saturday and also at the box office."

The Ottawa club contended such payments did not contravene the league ruling. Amount of the travel allowance was said to be \$200 a player.

The EFC decided to allow the arrangement to stand for Saturday's game only and ruled that any other such offer on the part of an EFC club would lead to disciplinary action.

A sell-out crowd was expected at the 20,000-seat McMahon Stadium for the game

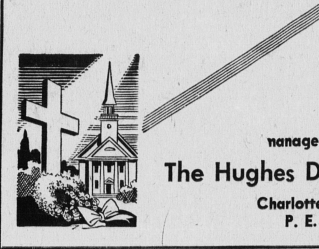
