Debate on the Address

SIR RICHARD CARTWRIGHT ABUSIVE.

Stirring and not very Creditable Passages at Arms.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

OTTAWA, March 23.—Sir Richard Cartwright was besides himself with anger yesterday when in the course of his speech on the address he called Sir Charles Tupper a "mischievous demagogue."

The speaker called Sir Richard promptly to order and compelled him to qualify his epithet.

Sir Richard dealt principally with the Joint High Commission.

Clarke Wallace followed, scoring many good points. His contribution to the debate was the able analysis which he gave of the preferential tariff as it applies to the Motherland.

The debate was continued by Casey, Taylor, Lemieux and Monk.

The latter twitted Lemieux with raising a race and a religious cry in Bagot.

Lemieux denied it, whereupon Monk repeated the charge. The Deputy speaker called Monk to order this in turn elicited a protest from Sir Charles Tupper. But the deputy speaker stuck to his ruling and the matter dropped.

Senator McSweeney took his seat in the Upper House.

Hon. Mr. Mills announced his intention to introduce important legislation in the Senate before the holidays. The Senate may adjourn in two or three weeks, time.

In the debate on the address, Hon. Mr. Scott said the government had gone as far in the direction of free trade as was wise and prudent.

AMERICA'S FUTURE.

The Sensational Prediction of an Imaginative Frenchman.

A Frenchman, with a Frenchman's imagination, has just given in an editorial in a Marseilles paper a foreglimpse of America's future that surpasses even the wildest dreams of American believers in manifest destiny. In substance the prophecy is as follows:—

"The American nation is engrossed in the work of establishing order in its new territorial acquisitions and planning a system of government for its colonies. After the satisfactory adjustment of these problems the United States will set about obtaining control of the Caribbean sea. It has sought and obtained the concession of the Nicaraguan republic for the construction of an immense inter-oceanic canal, insuring rapid naval communication between its two great coasts. One of the next consequences will be the gradual absorption of the four little Central American republics—Costa Rica, Nicaragua, Honduras and Guatemala. As for Mexico, day by day American influence is becoming more preponderant, meeting with little or no resistance, so that it is only a matter of time before the Mexicans succumb to the superiority of their northern neighbors. To avoid war Great Britain will sell Jamaica and her territorial possessions in Honduras to her transatlantic cousins, and finally Hayti will complete America's collection of the greater West Indies. Hereupon the insatiable American republic will cast a longing glance across its northern frontier. It will set about this work with prudence, however, raising an efficient army of 600,000 men and building a formidable fleet. Then it will postpone the invasion of Canada until the breaking out of the Anglo-Russian war. It is obvious that the issue of this double attack upon England will result in the latter's simultaneous losing both its North American and its Indian possessions.

NOTES AND COMMENTS.

—Several of the United States newspapers have recently made the conduct of Premier Laurier in regard to the prohibition plebiscite a subject of editorial comment. The following editorial from the Biddeford, Me., Evening Journal, shows that Laurier's peculiarities are known outside of his own county: "Although the Dominion of Canada, by popular vote, showed a majority in favor of prohibitory legislation, the liberal government has now officially stated that it will bring in no prohibitory measures. It says that too small a part of the whole number of voters took part in the vote on the request. This reasoning may satisfy some, but it is self-condemnation for the liberal government. The prohibitionists didn't ask for the popular vote; the liberal government proposed it, expecting of course an anti-prohibition majority. But they deceived themselves, for in a special election held at an expense of \$250,000, the prohibitionists won. And now the liberal leaders, like Rip Van Winkle in the play, are saying: "This time don't count." It will be hard to persuade the prohibitionists, at any rate, that the party in power has not given an exhibition of hypocrisy about 3,000 miles wide."
