## SENSATION IN N. B. LEGISLATION

### Mr. Hazen Publicly Charges the Premier

WITH PAYING FAVORITES MORE THAN THEIR WORK IS WORTH.

A Committee Appointed to investigate the Charge made.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

ST. JOHN, N. B., April 19.—In the Legislature last evening, Hazen, the Opposition leader, finding that the government were evading all enquiries into the bridge scandals rose in his place to a question of privilege, and directly charged Premier Emmerson with being officially connected with wasting the people's money by paying personal and political favorites two and even three times the market price of iron bridges.

The charge came like a bombshell. Emmerson, of course, indignantly asserted that his hands were clean, and finally, on his motion a committee of seven was appointed with power to call for persons and papers and take evidence under oath to investigate the matter.

Only two opposition members, Shaw and Glassier are on the committee, Hazen taking the ball by the horns.

The investigation will postpone prorogation for a fortnight.

### Parliament Prohibition Committee

## IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS

### Bertram's Yukon Amendment Carried

AND THE DEBATE ON THE ADDRESS IS ENDED.

Canadian Securities Affected by the Imperial Stamp Tax.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

OTTAWA, April 19.—The debate on the Yukon Administration was continued yesterday.

At 10.30 members were called in and a vote was taken on the Bertram amendment commending the course adopted by the Government in appointing Ogilvie to hold an investigation. The amendment was carried by a vote of one hundred and one to forty-eight.

Costigan voted with the Government otherwise the division was a straight party vote.

The main motion, that of the address in reply to the Governor General's Speech was carried on division and the debate on the address came to an end. Before the House adjourned Sir Wilfrid Laurier read to the House a telegram received from Lord Strathcona stating that the proposed Imperial stamp tax would effect all Canadian Government and other securities held or offered in England. The High Commissioner was giving attention to matters.

## DISASTROUS FIRE AT HALIFAX, N. S.

### A Number of Business Houses Burned.

THE ACADIAN HOTEL AND THE MAYFLOWER HOUSE

And a Number of Other Places Damaged by the Fire.

HALIFAX, April 19.—Fire this morning totally destroyed the buildings on Barrington street occupied by Angus Taylor, gents furnishing, loss \$3300, insurance \$1000; W. H. Cabot, dry goods, loss \$20,000, insurance \$12,000; Wm. Crowe, fancy goods, loss \$3000, insurance \$2,500. The Acadian Hotel was damaged to the extent of \$10,000, insurance \$6,500. The Mayflower House was damaged to the extent of \$4000, insurance \$2,400. Dr. Ianis, Dentist, etc., no insurance. Mrs. McPhee, proprietress of the Mayflower House lost \$1000, insurance \$300.

### THE SCHOONER ELIZA LOST.

Captain and Ten Men Drowned
