## IMPORTANT NEWS MAY BE EXPECTED

**GEN. RUNDLE BELIEVED TO  
HAVE BEEN FIGHTING.**

**The Despatches From Bloemfontein  
Are Conflicting.**

**Boer Guns at Work on Dalgety's Position—Brabant's Advance Guard at Bushman's Kop—Kitchener Making Disciplinary Changes—New Clothing Served—Bogus Ambulance Corps—General Warren's Movements.**

### GENERAL WARREN.

DURBAN, April 23.—General Warren has arrived here en route to East London, Cape Colony.

It is believed that he is going to the Orange Free State to assume an important civil post.

### AT BLOEMFONTEIN.

LONDON, April 23.—The Bloemfontein correspondent of the Daily Telegraph sends a despatch, dated Sunday, in which he says: "All the troops are being rapidly equipped with boots, clothing and other accoutrements."

Lord Kitchener is making various disciplinary changes.

The weather remains fine.

### ABOUT WEPENER.

MASEBU, Basutoland, April 21, (evening)—Four Boer guns have been hard at work all day on Colonel Dalgety's position.

The British guns have replied at intervals.

The Boers are divided into three divisions,—two being in positions to repel the relief columns, the distant roar of whose artillery is audible.

General Brabant's relief force is reported to be today in the neighborhood of Bushman's Kop, twenty miles from Wepener.

MAUSERU, April 22, (Sunday)—General Brabant's advance guard reached Bushman's Kop last evening.

### OPINION IN LONDON.

LONDON, April 23, 5 a.m.—It is quite probable that by this time General Rundle has fought a decisive battle with the Boers. He entrenched himself on Saturday to await the arrival of General Campbell with the 16th brigade.

That commander arrived on Saturday evening, and news may therefore be expected at any moment.

Still it is impossible to ascertain the position of affairs at Bloemfontein or to learn when the long expected advance northward will begin.

The despatches are in conflict regarding the state of preparations. For instance, the Bloemfontein correspondent of the Chronicle says that the troops have been supplied with winter clothing and that the Modder River has fallen sufficiently to permit the cavalry to cross. The Standard's report says almost the exact opposite. The present indications, however, point to still further delay.

## TWO DYNAMITERS AT WORK!

**Attempt to Blow up a  
Canal Lock**

THE DYNAMITERS ARRESTED.

It is Supposed That the Outrage is Due to Desire to Hinder Transport of Grain

THOROLD, Ont., April 23.—Two men, who have since been arrested at Niagara Falls, made an attempt to blow up Lock 24, on the new Welland Canal here, late on Saturday evening. The explosion badly damaged the four gates and destroyed hundreds of dollars worth of window glass in town. Dynamite was used.

OTTAWA, April 24.—The report of the dynamite outrage at Thorold has caused great excitement in departmental circles here.

At present the Department of Justice is without information as to the motive of the desperate deed.

The suggestion that it is Boer or Fenian depredation is most popular. But it is also pointed out that the blocking of traffic for even one week longer would have great effect on transportation interests and on grain markets. Many millions of bushels are now awaiting the opening of navigation at this point, and a few days more delay would cost in some instances large fortunes, and bring corresponding gains to others.
