## Briton, Russian Joint Winners Of Nobel Prize

**STOCKHOLM (Reuters)** — A Briton and a Russian were jointly awarded the 1956 Nobel prize for chemistry and three American scientists were announced Thursday as joint winners of the prize for physics.

The Briton is Sir Cyril Hinshelwood, professor of chemistry at Oxford University, and the Russian is Nikolai Semenov, director of the Institute for Chemical Physics of the Soviet Academy of Sciences. They were awarded the prize for research into the mechanism of chemical reactions.

It is the first time a Nobel prize has been awarded to a subject of Communist Russia, although Russian scientist I. P. Pavlov won the medicine prize in 1904.

**MADE CELL STUDY**  
Hinshelwood, 59, is an eminent authority on chemical kinetics and has made a special study of bacterial cell-growth in the light of physical chemistry.

The three American scientists are William Shockley, John Bardeen and Walter House Brittain. They were honored by the Swedish Royal Academy of Sciences for their investigations into semi-conductors and their discovery of the transistor effect in electronics.

Brittain, 56, and Shockley, 46, both work in the Bell Telephone Laboratories, Murray Hill, N.J. Bardeen, 48, is professor of electrical engineering and physics at the University of Illinois.

Transistors are minute devices having the same function as radio tubes. Their small size has permitted development of extremely small electronic devices such as pocket radio sets, hearing aids, calculating machines and aircraft equipment.

## Nehru Comments On Situation

**NEW DELHI (Reuters)**—Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru said here Monday: "What we are seeing today in Egypt and Hungary are both freedom and dignity outraged, and force of modern arms used to suppress peoples."

Speaking at the opening of the ninth session of the Unesco (United Nations Economic and Social Council) general conference he added: "In other parts (Social Council) general conference he added: "In other parts of the world also movements for freedom are being crushed by superior might."

"It is true that atomic and hydrogen bombs have not so far been used. But who can confidently say that they will not be used?"

Nehru's remarks formed the first official Indian comment on the Hungarian situation.

The Unesco president, Zavalala Muzic, told the conference: "Aggression, wherever it takes place, against whatever country, must be condemned by all peoples of the world."
