EXTERNAL ADVERTISING:

Responsible for soliciting advertising for the Radio Station and Campus Newspaper all contracts to be signed, drawing up all contracts in conjunction with the Treasurer of the Student Union, turning all information on billing to the Student Union having duplicate copies of all contracts and agreements signed.

MOVIE CLUB:

Chairperson responsible for the gathering of all staff, all booking of movies, the audio-visual equipment being used, obtaining the float and cashbox before each performance, turning in all monies collected to the Student Union Office.

CAMPUS POLICE:

CHIEF responsible for conduct of Campus Police while they are on duty, policing of all student Union events, writing up the worksheet, pay slips for the men on the force, calling all meetings when necessary, to the Comptroller, and to the Security Police Force.

SOCIAL COMMITTEE:

Chairperson responsible for all social functions on campus run by the Student Union the gathering of staff to work on the committee, the obtaining of the float and cashbox from the Treasurer before each function, advertising of all functions under the Student Union, the booking of all entertainment, turning in of all monies to the Student Union after each function, invoices which must be turned into the Student Union Office for payment, obtaining or renting all facilities and utilities, acquiring all licenses necessary for functions where required.

ORIENTATION:

Chairperson responsible for gathering committee members, calling all meetings, planning a list of events and making them public, presenting a budget to the Treasurer of the Student Union, all events during Orientation Week, all bookings of entertainment, obtaining case box and float before each event, requesting the appearance of Campus Police at all events where required, advertising, turning all invoices in for payment, obtaining purchase orders for all articles bought with the intention of reimbursement through the Student Union, acquiring all tickets and other supplies.

HEAD BARTENDER:

Responsible for purchase of all liquor from the P.E.I. Liquor Commission transporting all alcohol to the facility where it is required, running inventory on all stock, operating bar at specific functions when required, removal of all used bottles from facility following a function, bar facilities during use. Obtaining float and cashbox before each function.

CARNIVALS:

Chairperson responsible for all events during winter carnival (Octoberfest) booking all entertainment, obtaining of cashbox and float before each event, advertising associated with the various

events be presented providing a calendar of events obtaining Campus Police to work at all functions where they are required, turning in all invoices for payment to the Student Union.

PHOTO CLUB:

Chairperson responsible for obtaining all members of the club calling all meetings of the club, obtaining purchase orders for all purchases made through the Student Union, turning all invoices to the Student Union Office for payment. All photos for yearbook, Cadre, or others requested by organizations sponsored by the Student Union covering all sports events and social events.

YEARBOOK:

Chairperson responsible for dispersal of all books when they become available, laying out of the yearbook, mailing out of yearbook to the publisher, turning in all invoices for payment, obtaining all photographs from Photo Club, calling all meetings, and presenting a budget to the treasurer.

SPEAKER:

Presides at all meetings of the Council and the General Membership meetings and Executive Committee meetings. Interpret the Constitution and its bylaws subject to the Student Judicial Committee and enforce the rules of Parliament by procedure

according to Robert's rules of Order. Be a council member but not hold any other office in the union's sub-organizations or be a representative on the Board of Governors or Senate. Be appointed by Council at its first meeting upon recommendation of the Personnel Board.

RECORDING SECRETARY:

Shall record all council meeting minutes, keep an orderly account of the minutes and perform other secretarial duties as required.

STUDENT JUDICIAL COMMITTEE:

Chairman shall notify committee members of all meetings cases to be dealt with, inform Student Services, Security Police, be answerable directly to Student Union.

CADRE:

Editor-responsible for the overall operation of the paper, responsible for submitting budget to Student Union for years operation, for Communications with Student Union, its sub-organizations and other outside organizations with the exception of the Canadian University Press. Must maintain an atmosphere conducive to the well-being of the newspaper among staff members.

Triple Bill : The Marx Brothers

Here is your opportunity to see the insane Marx Brothers at their funniest. On Sunday, April 11 night from 7-11 o'clock you will see three Marx Brothers classics.

For those unfamiliar and also familiar with the Marx Brothers a critique of each movie would only be appropriate with films of such stature.

Monkey Business

As stowaways on an ocean liner, the Brothers emerge

from four barrels marked "Kippered Herring." Groucho proceeds to verbally rape one alluring "Thelma Todd," and in the process is entangled in a plot involving gangsters and illicit bathtub gin. The Marxes try to disembark by passing each of themselves off as being Maurice Chevalier, and they eventually wind up at a society party which they inevitably crash. For those Harpo Marx lovers, this film contains his fullest and most extended role.

Duck Soup

Duck Soup, a political satire on the meaninglessness of war is one of the Marx Brothers purest and most insane films. Since they refuse to take war seriously, Duck Soup has been said to be one of the most satirical as well as ridiculous war movies ever made. One of their shortest films, 72

minutes, Duck Soup contains a surprisingly amount of the Brothers' more famous sequences; the lemonade stand, a masterpiece of slow burn, the mirror scene (most famous of all) and a final battle episode which has been copied by just about everyone.

Horse Feathers

Horse Feathers has been said to be classic example of satirizing the college and political goings on in Groucho, as the College President, Quincey Adams Wagstaff, display the 1930's anti-establishmentism in a ridiculous song "I'm against it." This film includes a hilarious biology lecture by Groucho, Chico and Harpo as a pair of unlikely college athletes, and the frenzied football finale, involving chariots, hot dogs, banana skins, elastic bands, and countless pigskins.
