CONTRACT BRIDGE

North dealer. North-South vulnerable.

NORTH
♠ A Q J 5
♥ J 10 7
♦ K 5 2
♣ A 3

EAST
♠ K 6 3
♥ 6 4
♦ 9 6 3
♣ Q 10 7 6 4

SOUTH
♠ 10 8 2
♥ A Q 9 5 3
♦ J 7 4
♣ K 8

The bidding:
North East South West
1♣ Pass 2♥ Pass
3♥ Opening lead—two of clubs.

The technique of card play is not an exact science. A great many plays that are made are based on probabilities, not certainties, and some of these rest on assumptions which turn out to be false.

Nevertheless, good card play is a logical process, not a haphazard one. Sound reasoning, though it does not produce victory in every case, will return good dividends in the long run.

Observe West's defense in today's hand. He opened a club which declarer took in dummy with the ace. East playing low. The jack of hearts was led and finessed, losing to the king. What should West play now?

He made the only lead to defeat the contract. He led the queen of diamonds! Declarer won with the king in dummy, drew trumps and finessed a spade. East took his king, returned a diamond, and declarer was down one, losing a spade, a heart and two diamonds.

Was the queen of diamonds play just a lucky shot? The answer is No. The play had a sound foundation, and illustrates the approach a defender uses in a blind situation.

West can see, from looking at dummy that if declarer has the king of spades, there is no possible chance of beating the contract. He therefore must assume East has the king, otherwise he might just as well fold up his cards and concede the contract.

This assumption brings the defender to only three tricks—a spade, a heart, and a diamond. To defeat the contract a fourth trick is necessary. The only possible source for the fourth trick must lie in diamonds.

This suit must be attacked before East's king of spades is forced out or only one diamond trick will be won. Once this is determined, the question is which diamond to lead.

To lead the ace of diamonds or a low diamond can be fatal when West has the jack. Only the lead of the queen of diamonds can provide full protection against all possibilities.

Divorce Ridding Plan Rejected

OTTAWA (CP) — A unique method to rid parliament of Quebec and Newfoundland divorce cases was proposed Thursday by Senator Jean-Francois Pouliot. It was promptly described by government leader Walter M. Aelstine as unworkable.

Senator Pouliot (L — Quebec) said in the Senate that divorce petitioners from Quebec and Newfoundland, the only provinces without divorce courts, could establish domicile in a province with a divorce court and have the case heard there.

"The clerk (of the senate) could be instructed to tell petitioners to try their luck in a provincial court instead of coming here," he said.

Senator Aelstine said the suggestion "would not work at all. How could a person domiciled in the province of Quebec start an action for divorce in the province of Ontario?"
