Brooklyn Dodgers widened their National League lead to 10 full games Wednesday by shading New York Giants 5-4 in a three-hour, 17-minute, see-saw struggle. It was the first half of a day-night doubleheader between the arch rivals.

Pee Wee Reese's first hit in 18 trips, a single to left in the eighth, drove home Gil Hodges with the winning run for reliever Joe Black. Hodges opened with a single and took second on

Bobby Thomson clouted a two-run homer in the second but Hodges' 25th homer with one on in the fifth tied the score. The score was tied 3-3 midway through the seventh and tied again at 4-4 midway through the eighth.

The 24-year-old Kelly blanked the Reds on six hits for his first major league shut-out as Rogers Hornsby, the new Cincinnati skipper, made his first visit to Wrigley Field since 1933 as a National League player or manager.

Southpaw Mel Parnell turned in a three-hit pitching performance and Clyde Vollmer drove in three runs today as Boston Red Sox shutout Philadelphia Athletics 4-0 in an American League game.

Parnell gave up two of the hits during the first inning and then settled down to win his ninth game against six losses. Vollmer led an eight-hit attack against righthander Dick Fowler with his seventh homer of the season and a pair of singles.

The Red Sox clinched matters in the third inning when they scored twice on a double, a sacrifice and two singles. Vollmer homered with two out and the bases empty in the fifth and a walk, a sacrifice and a Vollmer single provided a fourth Boston run in the seventh.

Pittsburgh and St. Louis were not scheduled in the National League.

Marlene Stewart Continues Advance In Golf Tourney

EDMONTON, Aug. 13 — (CP)—The eighteen-year-old defending champion, Marlene Stewart of Fonthill, Ont., advanced without difficulty today in the Canadian women's open golf championship but the rest of the field fought to the wire.

Miss Stewart, back in fine golfing form after a hair-raising victory on the 19th yesterday, whipped Mrs. G. E. Wilcox, Jr., of Miami, Fla., 5 and 3.

Rae Milligan of Jasper, Alta., one of the top four qualifiers, was eliminated on the 19th hole by Mrs. Maurice Glick of Baltimore, Md. Grace Lenczyk of Hartford, Conn., open winner in 1947-48, had to come from behind to defeat Marlene Polk of Chattanooga, Tenn., on the 20th hole.

Mary Gay of Kitchener, Ont., and Edean Anderson of Helena, Mont., the two top qualifiers, came safely through the 18s. Miss Miss Gay scored a 3 and 1 victory over Anne Sharp of Fonthill, Ont., and Miss Anderson eliminated Ada Mackenzie of Toronto, five-time open winner, 4 and 3.

The sister act — Grace and Lorraine Lenczyk — was broken up when Lorraine lost 1 up to Polly Martin of St. Clairsville, O. Babs Davies of Vancouver defeated Mrs. N. J. Carlson of Toronto, 1 up, and Mrs. J. H. Todd of Victoria won 2 and 1 over Mrs. J. C. Whitelaw of Laval-sur-Lac, Que.

Three of the seven Americans were knocked out, one by Miss Stewart. Tomorrow the champion gets another crack at United States competition when she meets Miss Martin.
