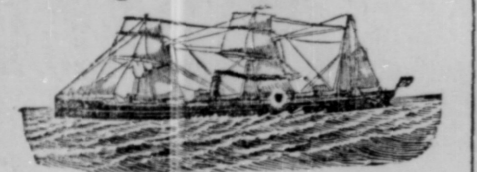

### Of Special Interest to our Farmers

#### Notes on Strawberry Culture.

The strawberry may be successfully grown in any soil adapted to the growth of ordinary fields or garden crops. The ground should be well prepared by trenching or plowing, at least eighteen or twenty inches deep, and be properly enriched as for any garden crop. It is unnecessary to say that if the land is wet, it must be thoroughly drained.

For family use we recommend planting in beds four feet wide, with an alley two feet wide between. These beds will accommodate three rows of plants, which may stand fifteen inches apart each way, and the outside row nine inches from the alley. The beds can be kept clean, and the fruit can be gathered from them without setting the feet upon them.

Culture in hills is the best mode that can be adopted for the garden. To obtain fine, large, high-flavored fruit, pinch off the runners as fast as they appear, repeating the operation as often as may be necessary during the summer and early autumn. Every runner thus removed produces a new crown, and in the fall the plants will have formed large bushes or stools, on which the finest strawberries may be expected the following season. In the meantime, the ground among the plants should be kept clear of weeds, and frequently stirred with a hoe or fork.

Where the winters are severe, with little snow for protection, a slight covering of leaves or litter, or the branches of evergreens will be of great service. This covering should not be placed over the plants until after the ground is frozen, usually from the middle of November till the first of December in this locality. Fatal errors are often made by putting on too much and too early. Care must also be taken to remove the covering in the spring, just as soon as the plants begin to grow.

Before the fruit begins to ripen, mulch the ground around the plants with short hay or grass mowings from the lawn, or anything of the sort. This will not only keep the fruit clean, but will prevent the ground from drying or baking, and thus lengthen the fruiting season. Tan-bark can also be used as a mulch.

A bed managed in this way will give two full crops, and should then be spaded or plowed down, a new one in the meantime having been prepared to take its place.

The number of plants required for an acre, at any given distance apart, may be ascertained by dividing the number of square feet in an acre (43,560) by the number of square feet given to each plant, which is obtained by multiplying the distance between the plants. Thus, strawberries planted three feet by one foot, give each plant three square feet, or 14,520 plants to the acre.

Plants set out in July or August will yield a moderate crop the next year.

As soon as it is learned in this country that fewer acres better cultivated are better than many acres carelessly cultivated, the greater will be the profits of farming. The great extent and original cheapness of farming lands have been a detriment to us agriculturally. When there are but few acres under cultivation they must be made to produce what we need and they can

be with less expenditure of time and efforts. The English farmer compels his few acres to yield as much as our many acres do, because his system is more perfect. #### Hoeed Crops for Young Orchards.

It is almost universally agreed that it is best for young orchards, at least until they get to bearing age, to be kept in hoed crops as much as possible in order to encourage growth.

#### Spraying.
