Premier's Message On Poppy Campaign

A message delivered by Premier Alex Campbell yesterday morning in conjunction with the poppy sales campaign by the Royal Canadian Legion which opened yesterday, reads as follows:

In Flanders fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
Take up our quarrel with the foe;
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies blow
In Flanders fields.

"John McCrae died in 1918." Poppies may be purchased from Legion members across the island, and in Charlottetown from Boy Scouts and Cubs who will be canvassing the whole city throughout the week. They may be obtained also at the corner of Grafton and Queen Streets in the City.

"The poppy is cultivated for the brilliant but short-lived flowers it produces. It is not this symbol most fitting to represent the brilliant but short careers of those who died that we might live? These soldiers, who laid down their lives for us, have left us with a great responsibility — a responsibility that many of us take too lightly — they turned over to us the battle against aggression, against repression, and against intolerance — and we must not abdicate this responsibility but continue to press onwards for freedom and justice."

"Or as John McCrae said in his now famous poem:

Blown Fuse Causes Power Failure Here

Maritime Electric reported last night that the power failure which left a goodly part of the city in darkness for approximately one hour and fifteen minutes originated as the result of a blown fuse.
