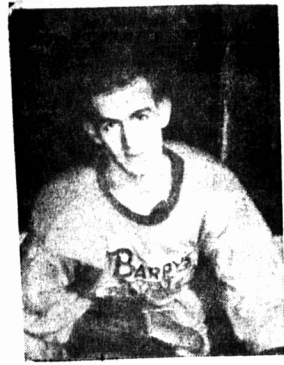


IN THIS CORNER
