NEW YORK (AP) - Steels were pacemakers as the stock market rallied vigorously Wednesday after three straight sessions of quiet decline.

The market was mixed and slow at the start. Steels advanced strongly and gradually attracted other groups. In the final hour the market made big strides.

The AP 60-stock average rose \$1.80 to \$223.30. Active Canadian issues included McIntyre Porcupine up 1/4, and International Nickel, up 1/4. Aluminium Ltd., and Distillers - Seagrams both dropped by 1/4.

American stock exchange prices were generally higher, but Scourry-Rainbow Oil, Sapphire Petroleum, Fargo Oil and Molybdenite dropped among Canadians.
