RCAF Ponders Japanese Planes

OTTAWA (CP) - The RCAF is investigating the possibility of purchasing about 30 Japanese-built MU-2 light aircraft, a defence department spokesman said here.

The RCAF has been "looking at" several different models to fulfill a requirement for an aircraft to be used for liaison purposes.

The MU-2 has a maximum speed of 310 miles an hour and cruises about 285, which is reported considerably faster than similar planes developed in North America. No cost estimate was available.

The defence department source emphasized no decisions have yet been made.

Rootes Setup Is Unchanged

TORONTO (CP) - Rootes Motors of Canada Ltd. will continue to operate independently unaffected by the appointment Monday of the Chrysler Corp. to handle United States sales of Rootes products.

E. J. Mackie, managing director of Rootes of Canada, said in a statement here that Rootes-Chrysler sales association specifically concerns the U.S. and has no Canadian implications.

Greek Captain Fined \$3,000

MONTREAL (CP) - A Greek sea captain, whose ship went aground twice in the last three weeks, has been fined \$3,000 for dumping oil into the St. Lawrence Seaway here last September.

A court spokesman said Monday captain Christoforos Samonias was fined Friday after charge.

His vessel, the Protostatis, went aground Nov. 16 at Wolfe Island, near Kingston, Ont. At the time she was being towed from a previous grounding when the towline parted.

The Protostatis has since been abandoned. Four Kingston area men have entered a joint claim for salvage rights.

The last of the crew left the ship Monday and headed for Montreal where they were to fly to Greece.
