The ice in the Red River has commenced to move. This is the earliest on record except in 1889, when it went out on April 8th.

Before its adjournment on May 8, it is expected the New York State Legislature will appropriate \$100,000 to investigate the civic departments of New York.

The extension of the China-Japanese war into Formosa is stiffening the prices of Oolong teas from that island, as it is expected the crop will be lost because of the troubles there.

The report that the Papal court has consented to the Colonias divorce is denied from Rome, where a civil separation was granted the Princess (a daughter of John W. Markay).
