Lema & Blancas Lead World Golf

SUTTON, Mass. (AP)—Cham-pagne Tony Lema charged through a steady drizzle with a four-under-par 67 to tie the rookie professional Homero Blancas for the 54-hole lead with 209 Sunday in the world \$200,000 golf tournament.

Lema, the 31-year-old 1964 British open champion, put together nines of 34 and 33 in rallying from four strokes behind. Blancas led after 36-holes at the Pleasant Valley Country Club's 6,713-yard, par 36-35-71 layout.

Blancas, 27, who joined the PGA tour last April, ran into trouble on the back nine as Lema applied pressure ahead of him and finished 35-36-71.

Jim Ferree took a 72 and dropped two strokes off the pace with 211.

Mike Souchak and Joe Campbell, who were tied with Ferree with 139s after two rounds, also faltered on the soggy course, each taking a 73 for 212.

PALMER MOVES Arnold Palmer, trying to break out of a prolonged slump, made a move toward the top with a one-under-par 35-35-70 for 212.

Canadian golfers remained well back in the bunched field. Wilf Homenuik, the Canadian PGA champion from Winnipeg, equalled Lema's 67, the best score of the tournament by a Canadian.

North Rustico downed Oyster Bed Bridge 8-6 last evening at Oyster Bed Bridge to win the last player listed after the 36-hole cut-off, hit 17 greens in regulation figures and carded two birdies and 14 pars.
