N. Y. Stock Sales Slow Last Week

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market had its lowest daily trading average last week of any week thus far in 1957.

Prices moved narrowly on average, putting the market barely ahead of where it was the previous week.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was up a mere 20 cents to \$173.90.

Wall Street observers agreed that the light trading represented a new high in caution, so far as investors are concerned, and they have been cautious for more than a month.

The five most active issues this week on the American Stock Exchange were:

Canada Southern Petroleum, up 1/4 at 8 1/2 on 69,600 shares; Pan-coastal Petroleum, up 1/4 at 10 1/2; Faraday Uranium, off 3/16 at 2 9/16; Barium Steel, unchanged at 10 1/2; and Fargo Oils, up 3/16 at 4 1/2.

There were only a few fractional rises among Canadian issues on the American exchange. Brazilian Traction rose 1/4 to 10, Fargo Oil 1/4 to 4 1/2 and Sapphire Petroleum 1/16 to 1 9/16. Steady were Canadian Marconi, Molybdenite and Scurry-Rainbow Oil, at 3 1/2, 1 1/2 and 3 1/16 respectively.

The five most active issues this week on the New York Stock Exchange were:

American Motors, up 1/4 at 8 1/4 on 174,900 shares; U.S. Hoffman Machinery, off 1/4 at 10 1/4; Royal Dutch, up 1/4 at 45 1/4; Shell Transport and Trading, off 1/4 at 23 1/4; and Bethlehem Steel, off 1/4 at 42.

Among Canadian issues on the New York exchange, Aluminium Ltd. continued to rise, climbing to 12 1/2 from 12 1/4. Canadian Pacific rose 2 points to 33 1/2. Dome Mines 1/4 to 13 1/4. International Nickel 1/4 to 10 1/4 and Hudson Bay 1 to 3 1/4. Distillers—Seagram dropped to 29 1/2 from 29 3/4.

Asks For Prompt Statement On Rumored Changes In Banking

MONTREAL (CP)—President Gordon R. Ball of the Bank of Montreal today called on the government for a prompt "public announcement . . . that no fundamental changes in the Canadian banking structure are contemplated without the fullest possible investigation of what might be involved."

Mr. Ball referred to a recent proposal by governor James E. Coyne of the Bank of Canada that chartered banks' personal savings deposits should be channelled into mortgage loans and other long-term securities.

His statement was a strong warning against "precipitate action" on something which would "involve radical changes in the structure and operations of the Canadian banking system." It also contained objections to the idea itself.

Mr. Ball said that the proposal was "undesirable and possibly dangerous."

He said he has approached Finance Minister Harris about Mr. Coyne's proposals, outlined in the Bank of Canada's annual report earlier this month.

They were highly technical ones which "at this juncture neither the proposals, the government, nor the public, nor the Canadian public, which would be affected by them, would have to accept responsibility for them, the banking system, which would have to implement them, nor the Canadian public, which would be affected by them."

Sees New Boost In Steel Prices

CLEVELAND (AP)—Steel prices, which have risen an average of about \$4 a ton since December, are due for another \$5 to \$6 boost this summer, Steel magazine says today.

The new price increase will follow an automatic wage boost guaranteed in the three-year contract negotiated with the United Steel workers last year.

Steel says production, falling off for several weeks, will pick up in May and June as customers try to beat the price rise.
