NEW YORK (AP) — A judge Wednesday ruled Jack Molinas, 21, was not entitled to damages or a hearing on his suspension from the National Basketball Association. Molinas, a rookie star for the Fort Wayne Pistons, was suspended by the NBA Jan. 10 for betting on his own team in 10 games.

County Court judge Samuel Joseph, sitting temporarily as a state Supreme Court justice, handed down the ruling.

Molinas, a former Columbia University player, now is a Brooklyn Law School student.

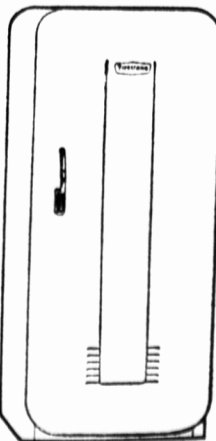
