World's Biggest Troopship Sails.

LONDON, Nov. 6.—Troopship Kildonan Castle, the largest troopship in the world, sailed from Southampton last evening for South Africa with more than 3,000 souls on board, with their kits and weapons, balloons and bridge pontoons, machine guns, ammunition and hundreds of tons of other military necessities. She takes 29 officers and 827 men of the First Welsh regiment, 29 officers and 261 men of the Second Northumberland Fusiliers and 33 officers and 425 men of the various other regiments and branches of the service, and a mascot goat presented to the Welsh regiment by the Queen.

Boers to Employ Privateers.

PARIS, Nov. 6.—The Temps corroborates the statement of the Emir that the Boers have decided to employ privateers and says:—"There is an immense fleet of transports now at sea carrying troops. The Transvaal government cannot seriously threaten these, but there is no doubt that it has issued letters of marque in Europe and the United States, and British commerce may suffer, even if the transports do not."

Boers ask an Armistice.

LONDON, N. v. 6.—The Ladysmith correspondent of the Morning Post recording under date of Oct. 31, the arrival on the British right of General Lucas Meyer with a large Free State reinforcement says that further additions to Commandant General Joubert's strength are expected immediately notably the Middleberg and Lydenberg commands, the latter under Schalkburg. During the fighting on Oct. 30th. The Boers asked for armistice for the purpose of buying their dead and attending to their wounded. An armistice was refused, but they were allowed to inter the dead under a flag of truce.
