directed explicitly at maintaining that quality in the face of very real budgetary restraints. Now that the report has been rejected, and a new Committee struck, I urge that it be given full cooperation. Our budgetary restraints are imposed externally, and are unique in that U.P.E.I. is forbidden by statute to budget for a real deficit. Our public image is generated internally, and will not be enhanced by predictions of collapse of U.P.E.I. The University will have to change in some ways, but we can, and must, develop so as to retain the integrity of its soul, the academic core.
