

Rice and Set Records Bearing Sweden 4-4

EDINBURGH (CP) — Canadian Eric Richard, 19, from Regina set a record total and individual rink score in defending Sweden's 4-4 tie in the 24-1 in the fourth round of the World Curling Championship here Monday.

In the other fourth-round game of this four-curling international series, Frank Lesman of Milling, Minn., defeated Scotland's William Young of Airth, 14-5.

The Canadian victory left Richardson's rink in front of the field with a 4-0 record and two rounds to play. The fifth and sixth rounds will be played today.
