5th King's P.C. Ass'n Holds Annual Meeting

The King's County Fifth District annual meeting of the Progressive Conservative Association was held in the Georgetown hall last evening with the president, A. H. Stewart, presiding. The minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved.

Plans were made for this group to attend the provincial Y. P. C. convention.

The election of officers followed. They are: President, A. H. Stewart, Georgetown, re-elected; vice-president, John A. MacGulgan, St. Mary's Road; secretary, Cameron Reid, Murray Harbor North; provincial representative, Daniel MacLure, Newport.

The first speaker of the evening was Major John A. MacDonald, M.L.A., P. C. candidate, who spoke on the high taxes, especially the hidden taxes of which fair returns were not received in public

works. He also spoke on the high price of goods and commodities to the consumer, and of decreased prices over the past several years to the farmer, and the serious effect the increased freight rates are having on the economy of the Maritimes. He stated that there were many instances of waste in the use of public monies, and cited examples of arrogance in the Government, which he said was too long in office. He advocated speedier assistance for the fishermen who suffered loss in the recent storm damage. Mr. R. R. Bell, Progressive Con-

servative leader of the Province, also spoke on many national issues, relating them to provincial matters. He was followed by Mr. Charles MacQuaid, provincial secretary, who spoke primarily on organization of the party for the forthcoming election.
