**FACTS FOR FARMERS**



**Farm Accounting Course Available**

Farm Management Accounting can use information contained in bookkeeping or shows how a farmer, regardless in his own records to farm more counting is not required. This is of the size or type of his farm, profitably. Prior knowledge of or a course in analysis of informat-

tion as opposed to a course in the "mechanics" of record keeping.

**DESCRIPTION OF COURSE:**

The course consists of ten sessions each approximately two hours long. The "case" method of instruction is used. Facts and figures of a fictitious farm are presented. The group with the help of the instructor discuss certain points of each session. Material for discussion is given for each session. In other words, this is not a "lecture" type of course. The value lies in "round table" discussion, it is hoped that each participant will, of course, relate material discussed to his own farm operation.

**SESSION TITLES:**

1. What Information Do We Need - to solve an income problem?
2. How Have We Done - what is the expense and income picture of the present operation?
3. Where Are We Making Money - a breakdown by enterprise.
4. What Are We Worth - a balance sheet - assets, and liabilities.
5. How Are We Doing in Comparison To Other Farms?
6. What Is The Break Even Point For Our Farming Operation - certain fixed cost and all operating cost must be met before a profit is realized.
7. At What Stage of Development Do I Sell - a look at the host enterprises.
8. How Much and What To Produce - to meet fixed cost and use resources available.
9. Did We Achieve Our Objective Last Year - comparison of actual performance to that which was planned.
10. How Can Capital Be Used More Effectively To Achieve The Profit Objective - what capital is available and the distribution and employment of that capital.

As stated earlier, all necessary material for discussion is presented in a three-ring binder. Each participant receives notes for each session which explains further the points discussed each session. The material for the whole course can be collected and saved for reference in a three-ring binder. Once again then, all persons taking the course receive sufficient

information to acquaint themselves with each topic and to prepare themselves for discussion of that topic.

A typical two hour session would consist of: Introduction and review 5 minutes Reading and preparation 45 minutes Break 10 minutes Class discussion 30 minutes Each session is related to another either directly or indirectly. In other words a person may miss one or two sessions and still benefit from the course. However, sessions missed will definitely leave a blank in the course. Consequently one should make up his mind at the beginning to attend all sessions. In this manner a continuity of subject matter can be maintained.

The value of this course lies in discussion and the material is prepared in such a way to prompt discussion. So with what material the course member receives and the discussion he participates in, I definitely feel this course will be of value to those wishing information pertaining to record analysis.

**GROUP SIZE**

Groups should range in size from 12 to 20. Larger groups do not allow time for everyone to contribute and are difficult to manage. Small groups have opposite effect, not enough differences of opinion are obtained. Both husbands and wives are invited.

The fee charged will be \$15. Husband and wife teams will be counted as one for fee payment and two for group size. Money remaining after expenses are paid could be used in any way the group decides such as tours, etc.

**Atom Study Step Taken**

**HAMBURG (Reuters)** - A team of West German and American scientists announced a step forward in the quest for knowledge about the character of the atom.

In an all-night session at the West German Electron Synchrotron Research Institute in Hamburg Wednesday night, the 11-member team for the first time produced "anti-protons" by bombarding protons with light, confirming a 20-year-old theory. A proton is a particle of the nucleus, or central core, of an

atom. An anti-proton is a particle with an opposite electrical charge to the proton.

Until now, anti-protons have only been created by bombarding protons with protons—that is bombarding matter with matter. Professor Peter Staehelin, head of the team, denied an earlier Reuters report that the experiment meant a breakthrough to sources of energy which could eclipse conventional nuclear power. "The theory cannot be interpreted in terms of nuclear energy," he said.

An American scientist said the discovery would have no foreseeable practical application.

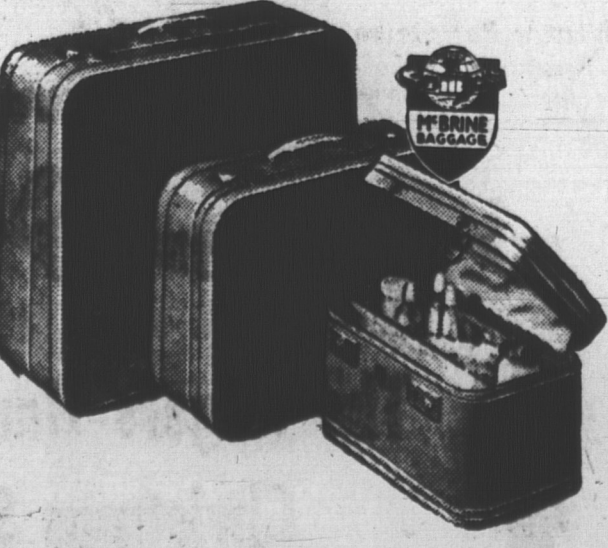
