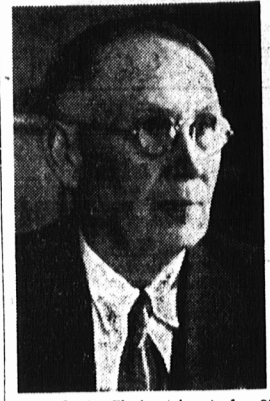

British Planes Score

SEOUL, Korea, Aug. 10 (AP)—B-115 carrier-based planes shot down their first Communist jet Saturday in fiery dogfight over North Korea between 10 Sea Fury from the H.M.S. Ocean and 13 Russian-built Mig. The far east naval command said the Furies also damaged three Mig. Two of the propeller-driven British planes landed safely after sustaining minor damage.

Agreement On Commonwealth Forces In Japan

TOKYO, Aug. 10 (Reuters)—Commonwealth ground forces in Southern Japan will be restricted "as much as possible" to Hiro, a town a few miles from Kure, by a provisional agreement between the United Nations and Japan made public Saturday. Naval forces will limit themselves to minimum facilities at Kure, former Japanese naval base and arsenal.
