# New R.C.M.P. Barracks At Souris Opened Yesterday

The opening of the new R.C.M.P. barracks at Souris took place yesterday afternoon, and in spite of the inclement weather a large crowd of citizens was on hand to attend the ceremony. Mr. Lawrence, Federal architectural engineer for The Atlantic Region acted as chairman, representing the Federal Minister of Public Works. Pupils of grade 1 to 8 of the Souris public school under the supervision of Mrs. Gladys Fouchere rendered "O Canada."

Mr. Lawrence then called on Mayor Bruce L. Stewart, who thanked the people that were instrumental in having this building constructed here.

Mayor Stewart then gave a brief history of the origin of the R.C.M.P. and brought it up to the present day, and he highly complimented the local staff for their efficiency in the past and wished them continued success.

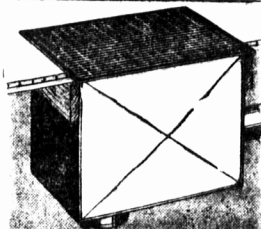
