Fire In Rooms Of Air Force Ass'n

A fire alarm, about 2 a.m. Sunday morning, touched off by the release of a recently installed sprinkler system in the Journal Building, led to discovery of a fire which completely destroyed a big lounge chair in the Air Force Wing Association rooms in the building, filling the place with smoke and resulting in minor loss or damage by water, to some paper stock located in the Journal basement.

The fire originated in the lounge chair in a room on the ground floor, and as the chair was destroyed by flames the heat touched off one of the sprinklers near the ceiling and directly above the chair, and resulted in the sounding of the automatic fire alarm.

Firemen quickly responded to the general fire alarm sounded by the police, and in removing the remnants of the chair to the street eliminated the danger of the fire spreading through the building.



POSTMASTER

The appointment of Charles I. Peters as postmaster at Summerside was announced on the weekend, and will become effective on July 2nd on the retirement of Postmaster W.A. Allen.

Mr. Peters, now acting-postmaster, was installed in this office on Friday by Mr. F.A. Coyle, area supt. of postal services, Charlottetown.

Joining the postal staff in May 1911, Mr. Peters has been on the staff here continuously for the past 46 years.

In 1948 he promoted postal supervisor at Summerside, where he has seen the staff expand from four to a present staff of fourteen.

In this time, too, great strides have been made in postal services through improved transportation which has increased from three incoming and outgoing mails daily, to a present schedule of seven, including airmails.

Mr. Peters has an enviable record of service in the Postal Department, never having lost any time from work due to illness throughout his long service.

On Friday evening the postal staff assembled at the office where a presentation was made to the retiring postmaster, W.A. Allen, who had served as postmaster since 1924.

Sacrament Of Confirmation Is Administered

In St. Paul's Church yesterday afternoon at Summerside, His Excellency Bishop McEachern administered the sacrament of confirmation to a class of 354 children and 12 adults. He was assisted by Rev. Joseph MacLeod, Rev. Francis Cameron and Rev. P.F. MacDonald.

Following confirmation His Excellency addressed the congregation, his remarks being directed in particular to the children, reminding them of the nature of the sacrament they had received and the responsibilities assumed. He warned them of the dangers that will beset them, exhorted them to enter the religious calling if they felt that such a vocation was theirs.

The services concluded with the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.
