PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE.

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

FRIDAY, April 23.

Hon. Mr. Strong thought the clause, as it stood in the bill, fully met the objection of the Governor General to the bill of last year. It would be the duty of the Commissioner of public lands to notify the proprietors without unnecessary delay. There was no party feeling in the matter.

Hon. Mr. Laird admitted that the bill was some improvement upon the bill of last year, but only one proprietor might be notified at a time, and the various delays in settling matters in dispute would be about forty percent more than it would be if the bill were passed.

Hon. Mr. Laird remarked that the preamble to the compulsory bill of last year said there was no prospect of the proprietors selling at a reasonable price, and what then was the use of introducing a bill to enable the Government to purchase? The Government was still without any offers of lands; and if they were, the Government would not purchase them.
