Roumania Cannot Strip Hungary

PARIS, Aug. 17.—Rumania will not be permitted to strip Hungary according to the draft of the Supreme Council's reply to the last note from Bucharest which was completed at today's meeting of the council. The Bucharest Government is informed that the fixing of the amount of reparation to be made by Hungary, as well as its distributors, is a matter under control of the Allied and Associated powers and that until final decision is reached all war railways and agricultural material going to Hungary subject to distribution will be under the control of the Allied powers.

Direct Trade Ireland to France

LONDON, August 18.—Representatives of the French Ministry of Commerce stated to a meeting of the Dublin Chamber of Commerce yesterday that steps have been taken by financiers to inaugurate a shipping line to run between Bordeaux, Havre, Dublin, Belfast, and Cork. It was decided at the meeting to appoint a committee to develop direct trade between Ireland and France.
