The accident happened about 7.15 yesterday morning when the car went off the road, struck a pole, severing it. The car was owned by Paul Douglas Banks of Saint John, N.B.

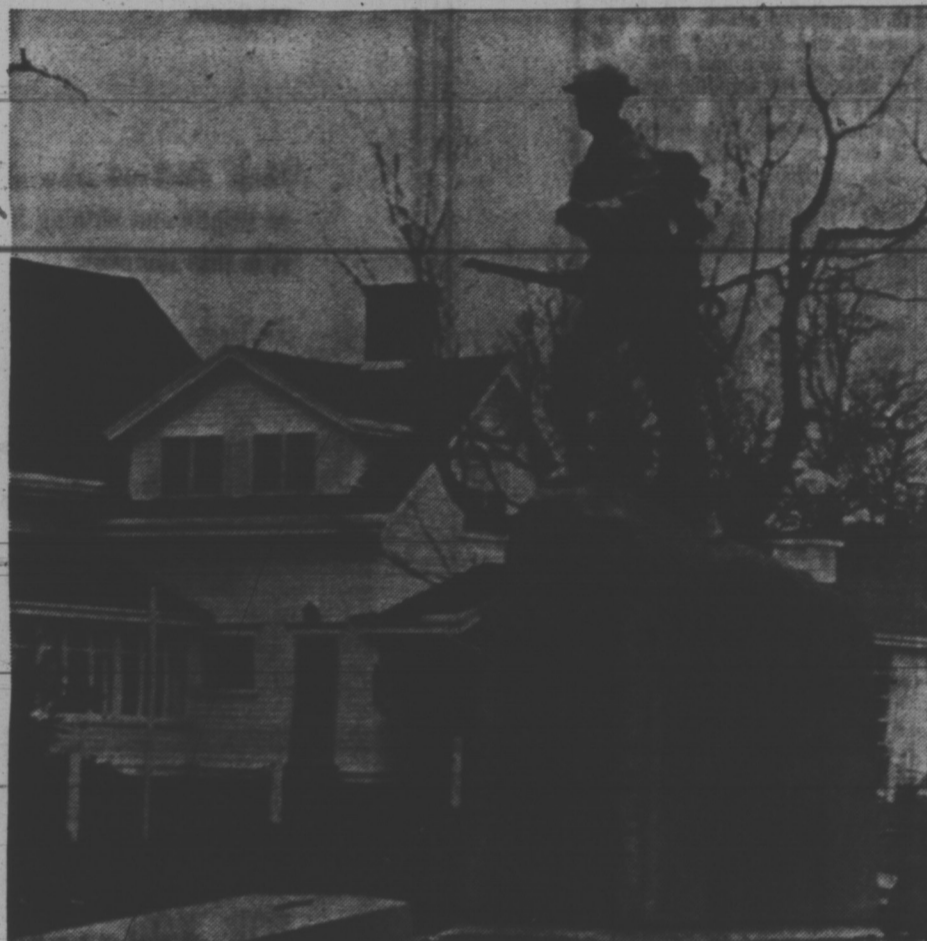
