

Barn proposal incomplete

President Meincke, Jim Griffith and four members of the student council recently discussed a proposed five year contract to lease the second floor of the Barn as a restaurant.

Council turned down the proposal brought forward by Griffith and if any concrete proposals are put forward by

food companies, the Council would make a decision at that time.

Student Union President, Jack Keefe, said problems with such a contract could include "the wear and tear on facilities, power requirements, and the loss of space, which would mean fewer people could attend the main events." Keefe says the

university is Government subsidized and some people feel that it shouldn't involve itself in private industry.

"But the main problem" Keefe said "is that there are no concrete proposals" and the council doesn't want to sign anything until the plans are known. "It would be like signing a contract without reading it first."

Anti-electroshock Demo

TORONTO (CUP) — Former recipients of electroshock treatment were among 50 anti-shock protestors who recently demonstrated at a Toronto psychiatric institution.

The Ontario Coalition to Stop Electroshock wants Canada to ban the treatment, said Don Weitz, one of the protestors in front of the Clarke Institute of Psychiatry, Oct. 29.

"We think it is a crime ... they call it treatment," said the former electroshock patient. Weitz said the treatment is "a form of lobotomy by electrical means."

The institute has give 2,500 people 22,000 shock treatments since 1966.

The Canadian Psychiatric Association supports the treatment and no medical association opposes it.

Psychotherapist Bonnie

Burstow said electroshock patients lose memory and suffer brain shrinkage that can possibly harm their creativity, energy, enthusiasm and ability to learn.

The treatment is used to jolt people out of depressions, but Burstow said more humane methods of treatment exist.

Similar protests took place in San Francisco, Denver, Philadelphia and Boston.

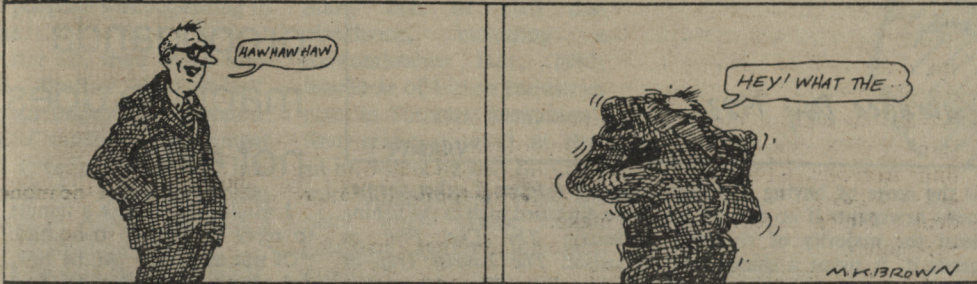

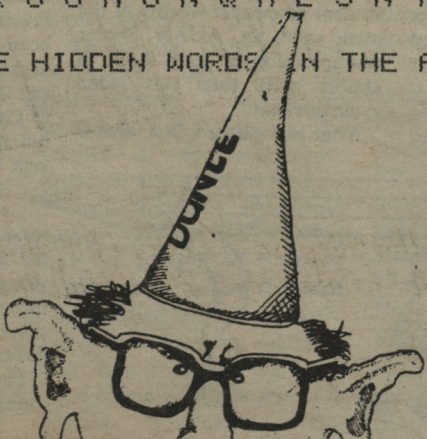
