Big Chance For Hawks

CHICAGO Black Hawks have an opportunity to take over undisputed possession of first place in the National Hockey League standings tonight when they are hosts to the listless Boston Bruins.

If Hawks can pull two points up on Detroit Red Wings as the result of tonight's encounter, then things are really getting hot.

Over the weekend Toronto Maple Leafs and Montreal Canadiens had loads of fun at the expense of the Bruins. Leafs crushed them under an 8-2 avalanche Saturday night in Toronto and Leafs walloped them 5-2 before a disappointed Boston fanbase Sunday evening.

McKinley, Hard Head Tennis List

NEW YORK (AP) — Chuck McKinley, 21-year-old mainstay of the American Davis Cup team and veteran Darlene Hard, head American tennis player in the 1961 Wimbledon tournament, were named to the United States Lawn Tennis Association.

McKinley, a native of St. Ann, Mo., tops the list for the first time. Second a year ago, he replaced slumping Whitney Reed of Alameda, Calif., as the No. 1 player in the rankings. Reed, who played the big year and was dropped to sixth.

Coach Gains His Talents Unappreciated in Britain

By ALAN WALKER LONDON (CP)—Geoff Dyson says his talents haven't been appreciated in Britain and when he signs a contract Thursday to become Canada's national director of coaching he hopes it will mean the start of an easier road to hoe.

"Britain is still in the broken-down, roll-neck sweater stage of coaching," Dyson said in a telephone interview Tuesday when the final contract negotiations had been announced.

"I would hate it to be thought that I am not wanted in Britain but the fact remains that British sporting officials are wary of powerful, professional coaches who may become national figures, no matter how much good they do for sport."

The 48-year-old track and field coach has had a long and checkered career in Britain, culminating in his resignation from the post of national coach of the English Amateur Athletic Association last year.

Now he will turn his experience in Canada in a five-year stint under the auspices of the Royal Canadian Legion. He said he will bring his own coaching staff with him.

Dyson said he hopes to raise the standard of coaching and, hence, the standard of track and field.

"Canada must build her sporting pyramid on a firm base," he said. "Canada has the potential to become the greatest track and field country in the world."

CITES REASONS "All she needs is the determination, the interest and the facilities. She could not say exactly what his Canadian opportunity would involve.

"I'll be lecturing a great deal, and travelling a lot, but other than that I can only wait and see what the legion wants of me."

He will live in Ottawa with his wife—the ex-Olympic hurdler Maureen Gardner—and his daughter. His son will stay in Britain.

Judge Confines Fighter Machen

FAIRFIELD, Calif. (AP)—Mentally-ill heavyweight fighter Eddie Machen was committed to a state hospital Tuesday as an "acute schizophrenic" in need of treatment and dangerous to himself and others.

The commitment was ordered at a 20-minute Superior Court hearing and was for an indefinite period, until his mental well being is restored.

Machen, who has gone berserk on at least two occasions since he was confined to Napa State Hospital last week, was present at the hearing. He was ordered to the Napa State Hospital for observation and his own protection last Wednesday when a State Highway patrolman found him in a car parked along the Highway near Vallejo, reportedly contemplating suicide. Cookie Gilchrist Named Football Player Of Year

NEW YORK (AP) — Cookie Gilchrist, a 245-pound fullback who spent nine years playing Canadian football before he joined Buffalo Bills, was named Player-of-the-Year in the American Football League Tuesday by an Associated Press committee of writers and broadcasters from the eight league cities.

Gilchrist received 13 of the 24 votes cast by the committee, Len Dawson, 27-year-old former National Football League quarterback from Purdue, was second with eight votes for his fine year with Dallas Texans.

"I have no college education so this is a question of money with me all along," said Gilchrist earlier in the season. "I had to battle all the time for the kind of pay I felt I rated."
