OTTAWA (CP)—Vehicles entering Canada during October on travellers' permits advanced about 16 per cent to 177,444 on the total for October, 1957. The 10-month total of 2,366,953 was just under the figures for the corresponding period last year, the bureau of statistics reported Monday, with October entries greater than those of a year ago for all areas except Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, British Columbia and the Yukon.
