Patriot Prize is Won By Ch'town Housewife

Mrs. Marina McGarry, a young woman who will shortly give birth to her seventh child, has won the Evening Patriot's Crossword Puzzle Contest worth \$1,400, it was announced yesterday.

Mrs. McGarry became the second winner since the contest was inaugurated by submitting a perfect set of answers to the puzzle contest questions.

She doubled her winnings by enclosing a sales slip from A. J. Zakem's grocery store, an advertisement on the puzzle page.

Strangely enough, the first winner, Ian MacNevin, of Charlottetown, also enclosed a purchase slip from Zakem's.

Mrs. McGarry and her husband, Joe, a fireman employed by the department of transport,

were quick to decide on how the money will be spent.

"Right after I was told by phone that I won the contest, I thought Joe and I decided right away that the money would go towards the purchase of a house. We were planning to buy a home for some time. This money will be a big help."

The McGarrys, who now live in a rented apartment at 233 Grafton Street, can use a new home they had already large family getting larger.
