Busy Magistrate's Court Hears 4 Impaired Charges

GEORGETOWN — A large docket faced Kings County Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, at Georgetown yesterday. The Crown was represented by Deputy Attorney General J. Arthur MacGuigan, QC. Carl William Collins of Sturgeon, charged with impaired driving and represented by Lester O'Donnell, was found guilty and fined \$100 and costs following the evidence of Cal. Miles E. Foster and Cal. Kenneth Lynn of the Montague Detachment RCMP.

James Stephen Murphy also of Sturgeon, and represented by Mr. O'Donnell, charged with a similar offence heard the evidence of the third crown witness in his case. It was adjourned to July 8 for judgment. Robert Leard Borden Graham of Gasperaux pleaded guilty and was fined \$100 also for impaired driving.

Students Plugging Flag On Sea To Sea Trek
Yesterday afternoon Bob MacNair and Tom Tyre left their hitch-hiking to Vancouver. This is to be no trip without a purpose: they are making this trek carrying with them a full scale flag. The flag is the one that Prime Minister Pearson proposed to the country a few weeks ago, three red maple leaves on a white background with two wide blue borders, and the boys are taking it across the country to show it off to the people. Both boys are sixteen years old and are from Os'ville, Ontario, they had their way paid down from there by a Toronto radio station, but will be making the rest of the trip on their own. This morning they dipped the flag in the water of Hillsboro Bay and when they get to Vancouver they will dip it again in the Pacific, symbolizing the sea to sea aspect that the blue borders represent. The boys are working on a very loose time schedule and expect to arrive in Vancouver about three weeks from now. The one definite date they have set is to be in Ottawa on July 1st. The boys are travelling very light and plan to do the trip as cheaply as possible. They spent part of last night in the cells of the city police in City Hall, but they couldn't stand the smell so they left and finished their sleep in an all night laundromat. The boys expect the whole trip will take seven to eight weeks and they will travel to Vancouver via the Trans Canada Highway. They think that they will return through the Northern United States to give themselves a little variety. They will return to Os'ville in late August or early September when Tom will enter grade 12 and Bob goes into grade 13.

Macquarrie Questions CNR
OTTAWA — Health Macquarrie (MP Queens) has placed two questions about CNR services in the Atlantic Provinces on the Commons order table. He is asking what meals are available for car passengers on the Ocean Limited under the Red, White and Blue fare plan, and how many days prior to June 14 were such passengers entitled to breakfast only, and also what reduction has been made in the price of tickets for such passengers. Additionally Mr. Macquarrie has asked a series of questions on the CNR depot in Moncton, including total floor space and seating capacity in the waiting rooms, the floor space seating capacity of the former station building, how many trains stop over there and whether or not there has been an increase in passenger travel on trains passing through or originating from Moncton since 1961.
