

# Approach Lights To Be Installed At S'ide Airport; To Cost \$90,000

Air Commodore Martin Costello, air officer commanding Maritime Air Command, on an annual tour of inspection at RCAF Station Summerside yesterday told a press conference that approach lights will be installed on airforce property at both ends of one runway at Summerside at a cost of about \$90,000.

Questioned about an earlier report that the construction of a new hangar at Summerside was being considered he said the matter is still under consideration. Air Commodore Martin had no comment on the future strength of the station except to say that no further reduction in its present strength is contemplated. The overall reduction of air force personnel due to the transfer of navigation training from the station was in the vicinity of 400 persons, it was learned.

Today is Remembrance Day. Once again we gather together before memorials of the honored war dead, and offer our tributes to their heroism and to their sacrifice, deathless things which light up the "dusty road to death" with a hallowed glory. They gave up their lives that we might live in a free world, and it is fitting we should hold them in grateful remembrance.

It is also fitting that we should do our utmost to preserve the liberty which their sacrifice made possible for us. We must pray for a cessation of the "cold war" which has cast its threatening shadow over this generation. In addition to formal prayer, we must pray with the labor of our heads, hearts and hands, for as the poet has put it, "to labor is to pray." The influence which the man on the street can have on the world situation is infinitesimal indeed, but the less intolerance, injustice and discrimination there are among the rank and file of the nation, the stronger is that nation to confront the "fifth column" and its insidious propaganda which ceaselessly seeks to undermine democracy's strength.

# Former Iranian Foreign Minister Shot To Death By Firing Squad Yesterday

(By Don Schwind)  
TEHRAN, Iran (AP)— Hossein Fatemi was lashed to a stake before a mud wall Wednesday and riddled with 16 bullets for being a traitor to the Shah.  
Thus ended on a windswept barracks rifle range the life of the fiery pint-sized ex-foreign minister who had been the right hand man of former premier Mohammad Mossadegh.

He was executed in secret by a four-man squad just before dawn. Gen. Teimour Bakhtiar, Tehran's military governor, a witness, said the blindfolded Fatemi shouted as he stood tied to the stake: "May God protect you!"  
Other army witnesses said he cried out "This is Britain's work" and "The British are murdering me!" before four volleys crumpled him to the ground.

**EXECUTION UNEXPECTED**  
Fatemi was an uncompromising supporter of Mossadegh's extreme-nationalist policy under which the British-owned Anglo-Iranian Oil Company was nationalized in 1951.  
The 40-year-old Fatemi was sentenced to death by a military court a month ago for his part

# Believe Two Sisters Poisoned

MONTREAL (CP) — Police reported Wednesday that one of two sisters was found dead, believed from poisoning, in nearby Mackayville and the other was taken to hospital in serious condition from wounds about the head.  
Police said a note was found but gave no indication of its contents.  
Both are said to have lived in Montreal and to have gone to the home of another sister—Mrs. Ludwig Jannard—in Mackayville Tuesday, planning to spend a couple of days.

The dead woman was identified as Mrs. Alice Brewer, 45, and the injured woman as Mrs. Lucien Sanscartier.  
Police said Mrs. Jannard returned to the house after hanging up clothes in the yard and heard moans coming from one room. She found her sisters there.  
An autopsy on Mrs. Brewer's body will be held.

**MOSCOW (AP)** — The Soviet Communist party central committee ordered Red propagandists Wednesday to stop persecuting and insulting Soviet churchgoers and clergymen and confine themselves to "painstaking and systematic atheistic propaganda".
