

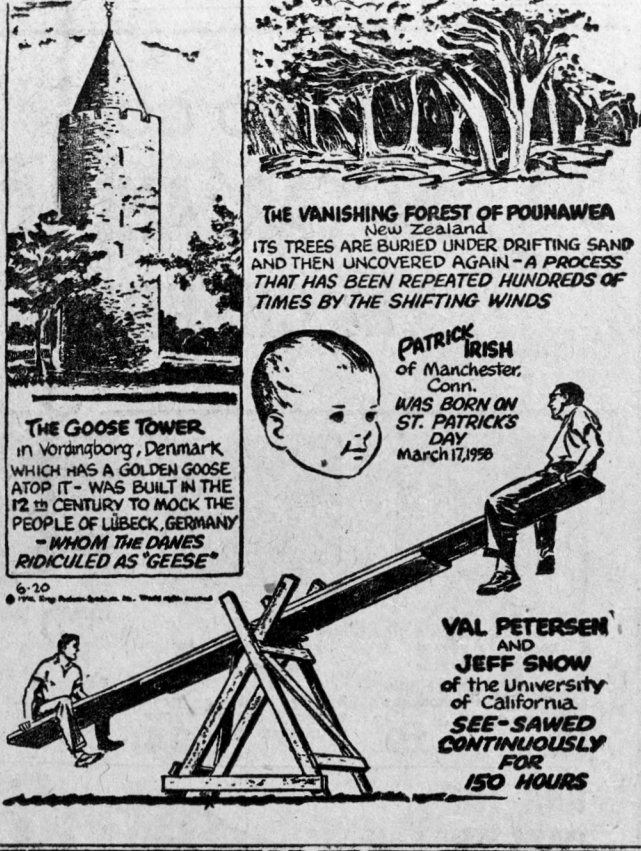

TORONTO (CP) — Four brothers who 20 years ago started a slum clinic, today will open a new wing on their own 300-bed hospital. With the slip of a ribbon by Attorney-General Kelso, Roberts of Ontario, Doctors Hospital will open its new 11-storey, \$1,400,000 wing, its third expansion since four doctor brothers bought the old St. John's Hospital, reported to be the largest privately-owned non-profit hospital in Canada, was founded by the Raxlen brothers, who make up the board of directors.

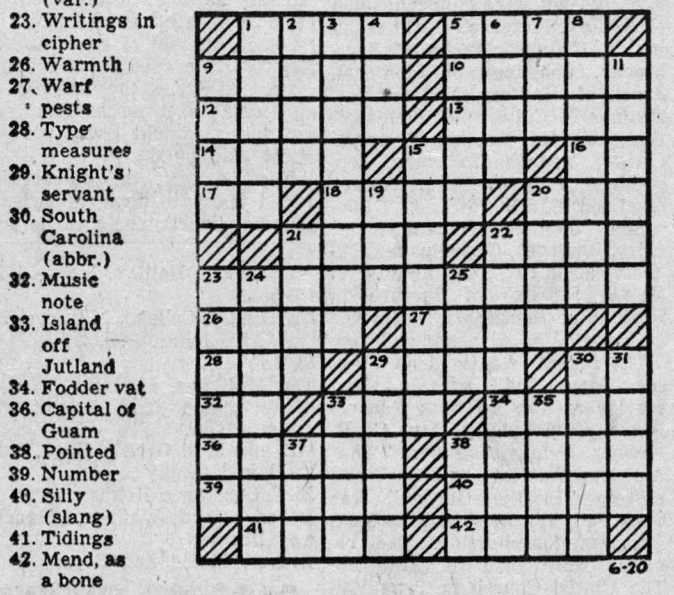
Richelieu River Waterway Urged

OTTAWA (CP) — The federal government Wednesday was urged to survey the Richelieu River with a view to creating a 14-foot-deep channel from the St. Lawrence River at Sorel, Que., to New York City. A brief submitted by a committee of business and municipal leaders from Sorel, at the junction of the St. Lawrence and Richelieu rivers, said a deeper waterway would be an economic boom to both Canada and the United States. It would create cheaper transportation for bulk commodities.

Independent To Run In Quebec MATANE, Que. (CP)—An independent and a Union Nationale candidate will fight it out in the July 2 provincial byelection in Matane riding. The surprise candidate is Claude Belanger, 38, a Montreal salesman who filed his nomination papers shortly before Wednesday's 2 p.m. deadline. He listed himself as a member of the "Partie Quebecois," but said he is an independent. Union Nationale nominee is Benoit Gaboury, 41-year-old mayor of Mont Joli and a merchant in that community. Present standings in the 93-seat Legislative Assembly is: Union Nationale 72; Liberals 17; independent three; vacant one.

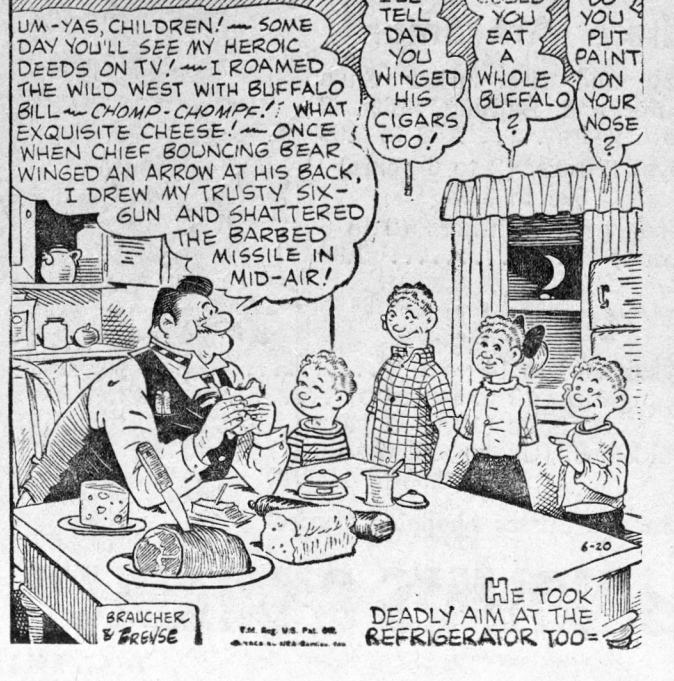

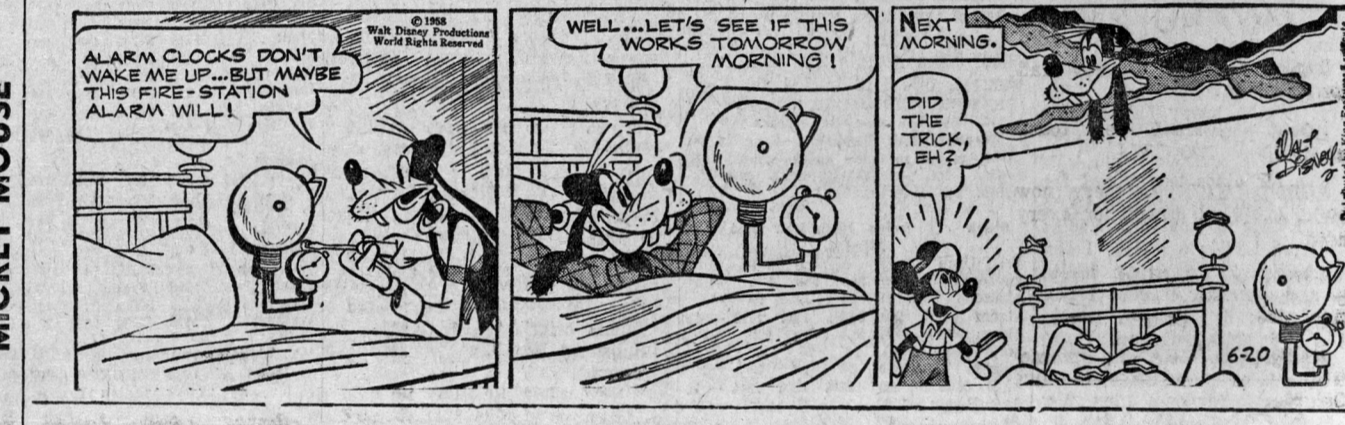
