Council meeting creates only discussion

Not only wasn't there a quorum at Sunday night's Student Council meeting, but they will be hard pressed to find one for Thursday night's emergency session. Only ten of the required thirteen members showed up in the faculty lounge and because of council's reluctance to step outside the 'rules (though that didn't appear to hold anything up during the summer, did it?) their hands were tied.

Instead of the regular meeting a general information session was held following the prepared agenda. Mr. John Carr, lawyer for S.U., spoke

on the Rent Review decision and it was learned that the 12% raise was applicable for only one year and would have to come under review again next year.

Other items on the agenda included Mike Clow's report on the money spent by S.U. over the summer to paint the Barn and partially repair the roof. The question of Bill Chandler, last year's comptroller filling the position until by-elections were held to replace Howie Adams who is not returning this year was raised but nothing could be settled without a vote.

Zurich Insurance, the emergency loan fund, the Photo Club, C.U.P. membership, Fallfest, the National Union of Students, the installation of two pinball machines, a pooltable and jukebox in the Barn, and a suitable arrangement to allow those under eighteen to attend Pigs and special dances were all discussed but no official decisions could be made on any of them without a quorum.

Top priority at Thursday night's meeting will be the voting on a date for by-elections, all councillors are urged to attend.

Administration hassling tenants at Blanchard Hall

Pressure from the University Administration on Blanchard Hall tenants has been met with warranted opposition.

Several Residents have been asked to move out of their rooms to other unfilled apartments, and threatened with rent increases. The reason given for the shifting was to make rooms available for rental to conventioners.

The problem reached a peak Tuesday night when two students

who had been assigned an apartment on the first floor, were threatened with eviction if they had not come up with a decision to move by Wednesday morning.

The Cadre has learned that the "lease" signed by students this semester, is the old agreement, and not legal under the new regulations.

Student Union President Derek Key, termed the situation as "An extreme infringement on tenant's rights."

Soccer Panthers off to great start

The U.P.E.I. Soccer Panthers roared from behind to gain a hard fought 3-3 tie in their 1976 season opener Wednesday.

The Panther's opponents were the Jumpin' Jacks, P.E.I. Senior Soccer Champions, a team of seasoned veterans and the pre-game favorites.
