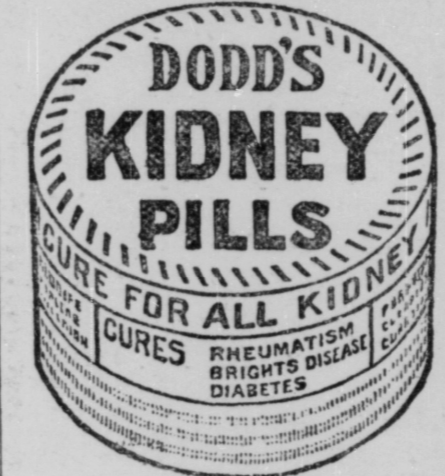

"Small Cap." Shafter.
"Pecos Bill is not the only nickname that General Shafter ever enjoyed," said an old newspaper man the other day. "Out in Denver he was known for years as 'Small Cap Shafter,' and as he is anything but small the title calls for an explanation. It seems that a banquet of some sort had been given to a lot of army officers, and among the guests was General, then Colonel, Shafter.
