ATHENS, (AP)—Greece and Yugoslavia announced Saturday they will be joined by Turkey in a new Balkan military alliance aimed at "strengthening peace and collective security in the spirit of the United Nations charter".

The three nations have been linked previously in a treaty of mutual co-operation. The new pact elevates this agreement to an out-right military alliance.

This was indicated also in the communique issued both in Athens and Belgrade announcing formation of the pact. The communique said the treaty provides for establishment of a consultative assembly of the three nations which will meet alternately in Athens, Belgrade, and Ankara to discuss mutual problems.
