TOWN BY-ELECTION JUNE 12

S'ide Council Protests St. Eleanors' Boundary The Summerside Town Council has protested the inclusion of the area between the St. Eleanors' Railway crossing and the town boundary in that part of St. Eleanors' proposed for incorporation under the Village Service Act, and has asked the Provincial Government that the area south of the crossing and extending to the western limits of the town be brought into the town of Summerside. The protest, in the form of a resolution, was approved at a special meeting of the Summerside Town Council on May 19th made public yesterday when the press were notified that this matter together with the acceptance of the resignation of Councillor James L. MacDougall from the Town Council, and the calling of a by-election for Tuesday, June 12th, had been approved by this special meeting one week ago. The resignation of Councillor MacDougall, for reasons of ill health, had been announced at the previous meeting. Nomination day for the by-election will be on June 5th, with election day scheduled for one week later. Following is the text of the resolution in regard to the area immediately west of the town boundary: "Whereas the inhabitants of the village of St. Eleanors or some or more of them, desire to avail themselves of the powers of the Village Service Act, and whereas the school district of St. Eleanors now includes a much larger area than what is commonly known as the village of St. Eleanors. That is to say there is a village situated at the corner of the main Western Road and town road in Lot 17, Prince County, and a further part of the said school district which includes that area south of the Canadian National Railway to the western boundaries of the town of Summerside. And whereas in this latter area there is situated a large tract of land owned by the town of Summerside, and a closely built-up area adjoining the western boundaries of the town of Summerside, which for all practical purposes is a suburb of the town of Summerside and dependent on it for many services and for employment. Therefore it is resolved that in the opinion of the Town Council of the town of Summerside that, that portion of the school district of St. Eleanors south of the Canadian National Railway be excluded from a body corporate under the Village Service Act as proposed by certain rate payers of the school district of St. Eleanors, and that said area should be included in the town of Summerside. And further that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Lieutenant Governor-in-Council."
